## Associations of "Stock in trade" (30 Words)

<u>barter</u>	Goods or services used in bartering. I took a supply of coffee and cigarettes to use as <b>barter</b> .
budget	Provide a sum of money for a particular purpose from a budget. The president submitted the annual <b>budget</b> to Congress.
business	Business concerns collectively. Government and <b>business</b> could not agree.
<u>commerce</u>	The United States federal department that promotes and administers domestic and foreign trade (including management of the census and the patent office); created in 1913. <i>The noise and warmth of human commerce</i> .
consignee	The person to whom merchandise is delivered over.
consignment	Goods carried by a large vehicle. Levels of <b>consignment</b> are running below budget.
consignor	The person who delivers over or commits merchandise.
courier	Send goods or documents by courier. A <b>courier</b> service.
credit	Accounting enter as credit. This deferred tax can be <b>credit</b> ed to the profit and loss account.
dealing	Method or manner of conduct in relation to others. <i>He has always been honest is his <b>dealing</b>s with me.</i>
<u>deficit</u>	The score by which a team or individual is losing. They have serious linguistic <b>deficit</b> s.
<u>emporium</u>	A centre of commerce; a market.
<u>export</u>	Of a high standard suitable for export. The <b>export</b> of Western technology.



exporter	A person, country, or company that sends goods or services to another country for sale. Japan has only begun to be an <b>exporter</b> of culture in the last couple of decades.
freight	A charge for transport by freight. A bill indicating that the <b>freight</b> has been paid.
<u>hype</u>	A deception carried out for the sake of publicity. <i>Is his comeback a <b>hype</b></i> .
importer	A person or organization that brings goods or services into a country from abroad for sale. <i>The EU is the largest</i> <b>importer</b> <i>of agricultural products from developing</i> <i>countries.</i>
marketing	The action or business of promoting and selling products or services, including market research and advertising. <i>The Western arts of marketing and distribution.</i>
merchandise	Branded products used to promote a film, pop group, etc., or linked to a fictional character; merchandising. Anyone who is not of that Guild may not <b>merchandise</b> with them.
sell	Sell all of one s property possessions or assets. These books <b>sell</b> like hot cakes.
shipment	The act of sending off something. Logs waiting for <b>shipment</b> .
shipper	A company in the business of shipping freight.
shop	Shop around not necessarily buying. She pointed to the classroom ceiling I live here over the <b>shop</b> .
shopper	A bag for holding shopping, that is attached to wheels and pushed or pulled along. A commercial centre thronged with <b>shopper</b> s.
shopworn	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse. <i>He brought out some</i> <b>shopworn</b> <i>lettuce</i> .
<u>store</u>	Have a supply of (something useful. Her vast <b>store</b> of knowledge.
<u>threadbare</u>	(of an argument, excuse, idea, etc.) used so often that it is no longer effective. <i>The song was a tissue of <b>threadbare</b> clich s.</i>
timeworn	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse. Parroting some <b>timeworn</b> axiom.
trader	A person who buys and sells goods, currency, or shares.



## **vend** Offer (small items) for sale, either from a stall or from a slot machine. *The company makes and vends environmentally friendly beauty products.*
