A grammatical category used in the classification of pronouns, possessive determiners, and verb forms according to whether they indicate the speaker, the addressee, or a third party.






Stoic as an Adjective

emotionless Unmoved by feeling.

Her voice was flat and **emotionless**.



exhausted Drained of energy or effectiveness extremely tired completely exhausted.

Exhausted oil wells.

Deliberately impassive in manner.

impassive He remained **impassive** showing neither interest in nor concern for our

plight.

inattention Failure to attend to one's responsibilities; negligence.

A moment of **inattention** which could have cost lives.

indifference Unbiased impartial unconcern.

It cannot be regarded as a matter of **indifference**.

indifferent Fairly poor to not very good.

The universe is neither hostile nor friendly it is simply indifferent.

Showing or feeling no concern for others' feelings.

She was remarkably **insensitive** to pain.

insouciant Showing a casual lack of concern.

An **insouciant** shrug.

lackadaisical Lacking enthusiasm and determination; carelessly lazy.

A lackadaisical defence left Spurs adrift in the second half.

Lacking zest or vivacity.

He was listless and bored.

nhilosophor A specialist in philosophy

philosopher A specialist in philosophy.

regardless In spite of everything; without regard to drawbacks.

He carried on **regardless** of the difficulties.

sleepy Inducing sleep; soporific.

Sleepyheaded students.

Having or revealing little emotion or sensibility; not easily aroused or

stolid excited.

Her face showed nothing but **stolid** indifference.

tired (of a thing) no longer fresh or in good condition.

I have to look after these animals when you get **tired** of them.

A lack of worry or interest, especially when surprising or callous.

unconcern He is famed for his laid back attitude his apparent **unconcern** about his

actions.

Not occupied or engaged with.

unconcerned The prisoner seems entirely **unconcerned** as to the outcome of the

examination.

unimportant Not important.

The question seems **unimportant**.
