## Associations of "Stoked" (30 Words)

<b>aflame</b>	In flames; burning. <i>Pour brandy over the steaks and then set <b>aflame</b>.</i>
<b>blaze</b>	Indicate by marking trees with blazes. <i>The horse had a <b>blaze</b> between its eyes.</i>
<b>brimstone</b>	Sulphur.
<b>burn</b>	Burn sear or freeze tissue using a hot iron or electric current or a caustic agent. <i>He was <b>burning</b> to try out his new skies.</i>
<a href="#">burning</a>	The act of burning something. <i>The <b>burning</b> of leaves was prohibited by a town ordinance.</i>
<b>combust</b>	Undergo combustion. <i>The professor <b>combusted</b> when the student didn't know the answer to a very elementary question.</i>
<b>combustible</b>	A combustible substance. <i>A <b>combustible</b> gas.</i>
<b>combustion</b>	The act of burning something. <i><b>Combustion</b> grew until revolt was unavoidable.</i>
<a href="#">crucible</a>	A situation of severe trial, or in which different elements interact, leading to the creation of something new. <i>The <b>crucible</b> tipped and the mould filled with liquid metal.</i>
<b>dross</b>	Something regarded as worthless; rubbish. <i>Alchemists tried to create gold from <b>dross</b>.</i>
<a href="#">erupt</a>	Erupt or intensify suddenly. <i>Hot lava <b>erupted</b> from the crust.</i>
<a href="#">fervent</a>	Characterized by intense emotion. <i>A <b>fervent</b> admirer.</i>

<b>fiery</b>	Very intense. <i>A <b>fiery</b> desert wind.</i>
<b>fire</b>	A fireplace in which a relatively small fire is burning. <i>If I were to hear anyone speak slightly of you I should <b>fire</b> up in a moment.</i>
<b>flame</b>	Be in flames or aflame. <i>A sheet of <b>flame</b> blocked my escape.</i>
<b>flammable</b>	Easily ignited. <i>The use of highly <b>flammable</b> materials.</i>
<b>flare</b>	Become flared and widen usually at one end. <i>Tempers <b>flared</b> at the meeting.</i>
<b>furnace</b>	Used to describe a very hot place. <i>Her car was a <b>furnace</b>.</i>
<b>hot</b>	Make or become hot. <i>The environment has become a very <b>hot</b> issue.</i>
<b>igneous</b>	Like or suggestive of fire. <i><b>Igneous</b> fusion is fusion by heat alone.</i>
<b>ignite</b>	Arouse or inflame (an emotion or situation). <i>The words <b>ignited</b> new fury in him.</i>
<b>impassioned</b>	Characterized by intense emotion. <i>She made an <b>impassioned</b> plea for help.</i>
<b>incandescence</b>	The phenomenon of light emission by a body as its temperature is raised.
<b>incinerate</b>	Destroy (something, especially waste material) by burning. <i>Waste packaging is to be <b>incinerated</b> rather than buried in landfills.</i>
<b>inflame</b>	Become inflamed get sore. <i>Her sister was <b>inflamed</b> with jealousy.</i>
<b>rekindle</b>	Revive (something lost or lapsed). <i><b>Rekindle</b> hopes.</i>
<b>smelt</b>	Extract a metal from ore by smelting. <i>Coal was used to <b>smelt</b> the steel for the tinplate.</i>
<b>smoulder</b>	Smoke coming from a smouldering fire. <i>The <b>smoulder</b> suddenly became a blaze.</i>
<b>torrid</b>	Full of passion arising from sexual love. <i><b>Torrid</b> jazz bands.</i>
