| aflame | In flames; burning. Pour brandy over the steaks and then set aflame . |

| blaze | Indicate by marking trees with blazes. The horse had a blaze between its eyes. |
| brimstone | Sulphur. |
| burn | Burn sear or freeze tissue using a hot iron or electric current or a caustic agent. <i>He was burning to try out his new skies.</i> |
| <u>burning</u> | The act of burning something. The burning of leaves was prohibited by a town ordinance. |
| combust | Undergo combustion. The professor combust ed when the student didn t know the answer to a very elementary question. |
| combustible | A combustible substance. A combustible gas. |
| combustion | The act of burning something. <i>Combustion</i> grew until revolt was unavoidable. |
| <u>crucible</u> | A situation of severe trial, or in which different elements interact, leading to the creation of something new. The crucible tipped and the mould filled with liquid metal. |
| dross | Something regarded as worthless; rubbish. Alchemists tried to create gold from dross . |
| <u>erupt</u> | Erupt or intensify suddenly. Hot lava erupt ed from the crust. |
| <u>fervent</u> | Characterized by intense emotion. A fervent admirer. |



| fiery | Very intense. A fiery desert wind. |

| fire | A fireplace in which a relatively small fire is burning. If I were to hear anyone speak slightingly of you I should fire up in a moment. |
| <u>flame</u> | Be in flames or aflame. A sheet of flame blocked my escape. |
| flammable | Easily ignited. The use of highly flammable materials. |
| <u>flare</u> | Become flared and widen usually at one end. <i>Tempers flared at the meeting.</i> |
| furnace | Used to describe a very hot place. <i>Her car was a furnace.</i> |
| hot | Make or become hot. The environment has become a very hot issue. |
| igneous | Like or suggestive of fire. <i>Igneous</i> fusion is fusion by heat alone. |
| <u>ignite</u> | Arouse or inflame (an emotion or situation. The words ignite d new fury in him. |
| impassioned | Characterized by intense emotion. She made an impassioned plea for help. |
| incandescence | The phenomenon of light emission by a body as its temperature is raised. |
| incinerate | Destroy (something, especially waste material) by burning. Waste packaging is to be incinerate d rather than buried in landfills. |
| inflame | Become inflamed get sore. Her sister was inflame d with jealousy. |
| rekindle | Revive (something lost or lapsed. <i>Rekindle</i> hopes. |
| smelt | Extract a metal from ore by smelting. Coal was used to smelt the steel for the tinplate. |
| smoulder | Smoke coming from a smouldering fire. The smoulder suddenly became a blaze. |
| torrid | Full of passion arising from sexual love. Torrid jazz bands. |
