Associations of "Stoked" (30 Words)

aflame	In flames; burning. <i>Pour brandy over the steaks and then set aflame.</i>
blaze	Indicate by marking trees with blazes. <i>The horse had a blaze between its eyes.</i>
brimstone	Sulphur.
burn	Burn sear or freeze tissue using a hot iron or electric current or a caustic agent. <i>He was burning to try out his new skies.</i>
burning	The act of burning something. <i>The burning of leaves was prohibited by a town ordinance.</i>
combust	Undergo combustion. <i>The professor combusted when the student didn't know the answer to a very elementary question.</i>
combustible	A combustible substance. <i>A combustible gas.</i>
combustion	The act of burning something. <i>Combustion grew until revolt was unavoidable.</i>
crucible	A situation of severe trial, or in which different elements interact, leading to the creation of something new. <i>The crucible tipped and the mould filled with liquid metal.</i>
dross	Something regarded as worthless; rubbish. <i>Alchemists tried to create gold from dross.</i>
erupt	Erupt or intensify suddenly. <i>Hot lava erupted from the crust.</i>
fervent	Characterized by intense emotion. <i>A fervent admirer.</i>

fiery	Very intense. <i>A fiery desert wind.</i>
fire	A fireplace in which a relatively small fire is burning. <i>If I were to hear anyone speak slightly of you I should fire up in a moment.</i>
flame	Be in flames or aflame. <i>A sheet of flame blocked my escape.</i>
flammable	Easily ignited. <i>The use of highly flammable materials.</i>
flare	Become flared and widen usually at one end. <i>Tempers flared at the meeting.</i>
furnace	Used to describe a very hot place. <i>Her car was a furnace.</i>
hot	Make or become hot. <i>The environment has become a very hot issue.</i>
igneous	Like or suggestive of fire. <i>Igneous fusion is fusion by heat alone.</i>
ignite	Arouse or inflame (an emotion or situation). <i>The words ignited new fury in him.</i>
impassioned	Characterized by intense emotion. <i>She made an impassioned plea for help.</i>
incandescence	The phenomenon of light emission by a body as its temperature is raised.
incinerate	Destroy (something, especially waste material) by burning. <i>Waste packaging is to be incinerated rather than buried in landfills.</i>
inflame	Become inflamed get sore. <i>Her sister was inflamed with jealousy.</i>
rekindle	Revive (something lost or lapsed). <i>Rekindle hopes.</i>
smelt	Extract a metal from ore by smelting. <i>Coal was used to smelt the steel for the tinplate.</i>
smoulder	Smoke coming from a smouldering fire. <i>The smoulder suddenly became a blaze.</i>
torrid	Full of passion arising from sexual love. <i>Torrid jazz bands.</i>
