gravestone	A stone that is used to mark a grave.
greige	A colour between beige and grey.
harlan f. stone	A crystalline rock that can be cut and polished for jewelry.
harlan fisk stone	United States feminist and suffragist (1818-1893).
harlan fiske stone	United States feminist and suffragist (1818-1893).
harlan stone	Material consisting of the aggregate of minerals like those making up the Earth's crust.
headstone	The central building block at the top of an arch or vault.
i. f. stone	United States feminist and suffragist (1818-1893).
isidor feinstein stone	United States filmmaker (born in 1946).
jewel	A person who is as brilliant and precious as a piece of jewelry. <i>She was a jewel of a nurse.</i>
kasha	Uncooked buckwheat groats.
kernel	Denoting a basic unmarked linguistic string. <i>A kernel of corn.</i>

pit	An orchestra pit. <i>The recent protests over planned pit closures.</i>
putty	Any of a number of similar malleable substances used inside and outside buildings e g plumber s putty lime putty or used for modelling or casting e g epoxy putty. <i>Countersink the screws so they can be covered with putty.</i>
rock	A large piece of rock which has become detached from a cliff or mountain a boulder. <i>The stream flowed through a jumble of rocks.</i>
sand	A light yellow brown colour like that of sand. <i>This magical coast boasts mile upon mile of golden sand.</i>
sandy	A light, crumbly biscuit, typically made with chopped pecans.
seed	A quantity of seeds. <i>Cut open the peppers and remove the seeds.</i>
semi-precious stone	Material consisting of the aggregate of minerals like those making up the Earth's crust.
taupe	A greyish brown. <i>A taupe overcoat.</i>
tombstone	An advertisement listing the underwriters or firms associated with a new issue of shares, bonds, warrants, etc. <i>His grin exposed his yellowed teeth like a row of tombstones.</i>

- alabaster** Like alabaster in whiteness and smoothness.

- boulder** A town in north central Colorado; Rocky Mountains resort center and university town.
- calcite** A common mineral consisting of crystallized calcium carbonate; a major constituent of limestone.

<u>carve</u>	Make (a turn) by tilting one's skis on to their edges and using one's weight to bend them so that they slide in an arc. <i>I carved my initials on the tree.</i>
<u>carving</u>	The action of carving. <i>A carving of an Asian elephant.</i>
caryatid	A stone carving of a draped female figure, used as a pillar to support the entablature of a Greek or Greek-style building.
<u>cavern</u>	Hollow out as if making a cavern. <i>His eyes were dark caverns.</i>
<u>cement</u>	Concrete pavement is sometimes referred to as cement. <i>Tile cement.</i>
commemorative	An object such as a stamp or coin made to mark an event or honour a person. <i>A commemorative plaque.</i>
effigy	A sculpture or model of a person. <i>Angry campaigners plan to burn an effigy of the social security minister.</i>
gargoyle	An ornament consisting of a grotesquely carved figure of a person or animal.
granite	Something having the quality of granite unyielding firmness. <i>Granite columns.</i>
gypsum	A soft white or grey mineral consisting of hydrated calcium sulphate. It occurs chiefly in sedimentary deposits and is used to make plaster of Paris and fertilizers, and in the building industry.
limestone	A sedimentary rock consisting mainly of calcium that was deposited by the remains of marine animals.
marble	A sculpture carved from marble. <i>A couple of girls were playing marbles.</i>
<u>memorial</u>	A recognition of meritorious service. <i>A memorial service in the dead man's honour.</i>
mineral	Of or denoting a mineral. <i>Mineral ingredients such as zinc oxide.</i>
<u>monument</u>	A structure erected to commemorate persons or events. <i>A handsome monument of granite is placed over the grave.</i>
obelisk	A mountain tree or other natural object resembling an obelisk in shape.
plaque	(pathology) a small abnormal patch on or inside the body. <i>Plaque around gum margins can lead to gingivitis.</i>

porphyry	Any igneous rock with crystals embedded in a finer groundmass of minerals.
quartz	A hard glossy mineral consisting of silicon dioxide in crystal form present in most rocks especially sandstone and granite yellow sand is quartz with iron oxide impurities.
rock	A large piece of rock which has become detached from a cliff or mountain a boulder. <i>Rock the cradle.</i>
sculpt	Create or represent (something) by carving, casting, or other shaping techniques. <i>She was teaching him how to sculpt.</i>
<u>sculpture</u>	A work of art made by sculpture. <i>A bronze sculpture.</i>
slab	Remove slabs from a log or tree to prepare it for sawing into planks. <i>She settled on a slab of rock.</i>
stalagmite	A cylinder of calcium carbonate projecting upward from the floor of a limestone cave.
<u>statue</u>	A sculpture representing a human or animal.
<u>tomb</u>	A place for the burial of a corpse especially beneath the ground and marked by a tombstone. <i>The house was as quiet as a tomb.</i>
totem	A clan or tribe identified by their kinship to a common totemic object. <i>Other radical groups look to the party as a totem of the anti austerity movement.</i>
