## Associations of "Stood" (30 Words)

<a href="#">astride</a>	With one leg on each side. <i>She sat <b>astride</b> the chair.</i>
<b>athwart</b>	So as to be perverse or contradictory. <i>Our words ran <b>athwart</b> and we ended up at cross purposes.</i>
<a href="#">bear</a>	(of a vehicle or boat) convey (passengers or cargo). <i>She agreed to <b>bear</b> the responsibility.</i>
<a href="#">bearable</a>	Able to be endured. <i>Things to make life in the tropics more <b>bearable</b>.</i>
<b>crossbeam</b>	A horizontal beam that extends across something.
<b>dais</b>	A platform raised above the surrounding level to give prominence to the person on it.
<b>easel</b>	A wooden frame for holding an artist’s work while it is being painted or drawn.
<a href="#">espouse</a>	Adopt or support (a cause, belief, or way of life). <i>A virgin <b>espoused</b> to a man whose name was Joseph.</i>
<b>homily</b>	A tedious moralizing lecture. <i>She delivered her <b>homily</b> about the need for patience.</i>
<b>lank</b>	Of a person lanky. <i>He sprawled his long <b>lank</b> figure over a chair.</i>
<b>patience</b>	Any of various forms of card game for one player, the object of which is to use up all one’s cards by forming particular arrangements and sequences. <i>I have run out of <b>patience</b> with her.</i>
<b>persistence</b>	The continued or prolonged existence of something. <i>The <b>persistence</b> of huge environmental problems.</i>

<b>podium</b>	Of a competitor in a sporting event finish first second or third so as to appear on a podium to receive an award. <i>Older riders who expected to <b>podium</b> may find themselves racing against other riders who are years younger.</i>
<b>preach</b>	Earnestly advocate (a belief or course of action). <i>He <b>preached</b> to a large congregation.</i>
<b>principled</b>	Based on or manifesting objectively defined standards of rightness or morality. <i>A <b>principled</b> person.</i>
<b>pulpit</b>	Religious teaching as expressed in sermons. <i>Many ministers delivered political guidance from their <b>pulpits</b>.</i>
<b>rostrum</b>	A raised platform on which a person stands to make a public speech, receive an award or medal, play music, or conduct an orchestra. <i>The winner s <b>rostrum</b>.</i>
<b>sermon</b>	A moralistic rebuke. <i>He understood that if he said any more he would have to listen to another lengthy <b>sermon</b>.</i>
<b>spindly</b>	Long and lean. <i><b>Spindly</b> arms and legs.</i>
<b>standing</b>	Executed in or initiated from a standing position. <i>A man of high social <b>standing</b>.</i>
<b>steel</b>	A rod of roughened steel on which knives are sharpened. <i>A <b>steel</b> will.</i>
<b>straight</b>	In a straight line directly. <i><b>Straight</b> dealing.</i>
<b>supine</b>	Offering no resistance- Theodore Roosevelt. <i>No other colony showed such <b>supine</b> selfish helplessness in allowing her own border citizens to be mercilessly harried.</i>
<b>tolerable</b>	About average; acceptable. <i>The climate is at least <b>tolerable</b>.</i>
<b>toleration</b>	Official recognition of the right of individuals to hold dissenting opinions (especially in religion). <i>All people should practice <b>toleration</b> and live together in peace.</i>
<b>undergo</b>	Experience or be subjected to (something, typically something unpleasant or arduous). <i>The fluid <b>undergoes</b> shear.</i>
<b>upright</b>	In or into an upright position. <i>An <b>upright</b> freezer.</i>

**vertical**      Something that is oriented vertically.
