| astride | With one leg on each side. <i>She sat astride the chair.</i> |
| athwart | So as to be perverse or contradictory. <i>Our words ran athwart and we ended up at cross purposes.</i> |
| bear | (of a vehicle or boat) convey (passengers or cargo). <i>She agreed to bear the responsibility.</i> |
| bearable | Able to be endured. <i>Things to make life in the tropics more bearable.</i> |
| crossbeam | A horizontal beam that extends across something. |
| dais | A platform raised above the surrounding level to give prominence to the person on it. |
| easel | A wooden frame for holding an artist’s work while it is being painted or drawn. |
| espouse | Adopt or support (a cause, belief, or way of life). <i>A virgin espoused to a man whose name was Joseph.</i> |
| homily | A tedious moralizing lecture. <i>She delivered her homily about the need for patience.</i> |
| lank | Of a person lanky. <i>He sprawled his long lank figure over a chair.</i> |
| patience | Any of various forms of card game for one player, the object of which is to use up all one’s cards by forming particular arrangements and sequences. <i>I have run out of patience with her.</i> |
| persistence | The continued or prolonged existence of something. <i>The persistence of huge environmental problems.</i> |

| podium | Of a competitor in a sporting event finish first second or third so as to appear on a podium to receive an award. <i>Older riders who expected to podium may find themselves racing against other riders who are years younger.</i> |
| preach | Earnestly advocate (a belief or course of action). <i>He preached to a large congregation.</i> |
| principled | Based on or manifesting objectively defined standards of rightness or morality. <i>A principled person.</i> |
| pulpit | Religious teaching as expressed in sermons. <i>Many ministers delivered political guidance from their pulpits.</i> |
| rostrum | A raised platform on which a person stands to make a public speech, receive an award or medal, play music, or conduct an orchestra. <i>The winner s rostrum.</i> |
| sermon | A moralistic rebuke. <i>He understood that if he said any more he would have to listen to another lengthy sermon.</i> |
| spindly | Long and lean. <i>Spindly arms and legs.</i> |
| standing | Executed in or initiated from a standing position. <i>A man of high social standing.</i> |
| steel | A rod of roughened steel on which knives are sharpened. <i>A steel will.</i> |
| straight | In a straight line directly. <i>Straight dealing.</i> |
| supine | Offering no resistance- Theodore Roosevelt. <i>No other colony showed such supine selfish helplessness in allowing her own border citizens to be mercilessly harried.</i> |
| tolerable | About average; acceptable. <i>The climate is at least tolerable.</i> |
| toleration | Official recognition of the right of individuals to hold dissenting opinions (especially in religion). <i>All people should practice toleration and live together in peace.</i> |
| undergo | Experience or be subjected to (something, typically something unpleasant or arduous). <i>The fluid undergoes shear.</i> |
| upright | In or into an upright position. <i>An upright freezer.</i> |

vertical Something that is oriented vertically.
