*80 000 square feet of **warehousing**.*

<b>granary</b>	A region producing large quantities of corn.
<b><u>hoard</u></b>	Accumulate (money or valued objects) and hide or store away. <i>A <b>hoard</b> of Romano British bronzes.</i>
<b>holster</b>	Put a gun into its holster. <i>He <b>holstered</b> the Browning before walking back.</i>
<b>kangaroo</b>	A large plant-eating marsupial with a long powerful tail and strongly developed hindlimbs that enable it to travel by leaping, found only in Australia and New Guinea.
<b>marsupial</b>	Of or relating to the marsupials.
<b>memory</b>	An electronic memory device. <i>I ve a great <b>memory</b> for faces.</i>
<b>misplace</b>	Place or position wrongly; put in the wrong position. <i>Crewe came back into the game when Strachan <b>misplaced</b> a pass in the midfield.</i>
<b><u>nostalgic</u></b>	A nostalgic person. <i><b>Nostalgics</b> who still take pleasure in experiencing the glories of the North American landscape from the windows of a car.</i>
<b>pocket</b>	Put into one s pocket. <i>A 6 000 acre <b>pocket</b> paradise.</i>
<b>pouch</b>	Make part of a garment hang like a pouch. <i>He <b>pouched</b> his fifth first prize by beating Higginson in the final.</i>

<b>recall</b>	An act or instance of officially recalling someone or something. <i>I can still vaguely <b>recall</b> being taken to the hospital.</i>
<b>recollect</b>	Recall knowledge from memory have a recollection. <i>He could not quite <b>recollect</b> the reason.</i>
<b><u>recollection</u></b>	The process of remembering (especially the process of recovering information by mental effort). <i>To the best of my <b>recollection</b> no one ever had a bad word to say about him.</i>
<b>remembrance</b>	The action of remembering something. <i>They exchanged fond <b>remembrances</b> of his gentle ways.</i>
<b>reminiscence</b>	The enjoyable recollection of past events. <i>His first works are too full of <b>reminiscences</b> of earlier poetry.</i>
<b><u>reservoir</u></b>	Anything (a person or animal or plant or substance) in which an infectious agent normally lives and multiplies. <i>The more water we use the more land has to be flooded for <b>reservoirs</b>.</i>
<b><u>retention</u></b>	The act of retaining something. <i>The soil s <b>retention</b> of moisture.</i>
<b>retentive</b>	Having the capacity to retain something. <i>Soils <b>retentive</b> of moisture.</i>
<b>sack</b>	The contents of a sack or the amount it can contain. <i>A <b>sack</b> of flour.</i>
<b>stash</b>	A store or supply of something, typically one that is kept hidden or secret. <i>One prisoner tried to swallow his <b>stash</b>.</i>
<b><u>stock</u></b>	Equip with a stock. <i>I felt I was right but my <b>stock</b> was low with this establishment.</i>
