warehousing The building up of a holding of shares in a company by buying numerous small lots of shares in the names of nominees, in order to make a takeover bid while remaining anonymous.
*80 000 square feet of **warehousing**.*

kangaroo	A large plant-eating marsupial with a long powerful tail and strongly developed hindlimbs that enable it to travel by leaping, found only in Australia and New Guinea.
marsupial	Of or relating to the marsupials.
memory	An electronic memory device. <i>I ve a great memory for faces.</i>
misplace	Place or position wrongly; put in the wrong position. <i>Crewe came back into the game when Strachan misplaced a pass in the midfield.</i>
<u>nostalgic</u>	A nostalgic person. <i>Nostalgics who still take pleasure in experiencing the glories of the North American landscape from the windows of a car.</i>
pocket	Put into one s pocket. <i>A 6 000 acre pocket paradise.</i>
pouch	Make part of a garment hang like a pouch. <i>He pouched his fifth first prize by beating Higginson in the final.</i>

recall	An act or instance of officially recalling someone or something. <i>I can still vaguely recall being taken to the hospital.</i>
recollect	Recall knowledge from memory have a recollection. <i>He could not quite recollect the reason.</i>
<u>recollection</u>	The process of remembering (especially the process of recovering information by mental effort). <i>To the best of my recollection no one ever had a bad word to say about him.</i>
remembrance	The action of remembering something. <i>They exchanged fond remembrances of his gentle ways.</i>
reminiscence	The enjoyable recollection of past events. <i>His first works are too full of reminiscences of earlier poetry.</i>
<u>reservoir</u>	Anything (a person or animal or plant or substance) in which an infectious agent normally lives and multiplies. <i>The more water we use the more land has to be flooded for reservoirs.</i>
<u>retention</u>	The act of retaining something. <i>The soil s retention of moisture.</i>
retentive	Having the capacity to retain something. <i>Soils retentive of moisture.</i>
sack	The contents of a sack or the amount it can contain. <i>A sack of flour.</i>
stash	A store or supply of something, typically one that is kept hidden or secret. <i>One prisoner tried to swallow his stash.</i>
<u>stock</u>	Equip with a stock. <i>I felt I was right but my stock was low with this establishment.</i>
storehouse	A building used for storing goods. <i>An enormous storehouse of facts.</i>
wallet	A pocket-sized flat folding case for holding money and plastic cards.
