fund	A sum of money saved or made available for a particular purpose. A concert to raise fund s for the church.
<u>heap</u>	An untidy or dilapidated place or vehicle. A heap of cardboard boxes.

memory bank	The area of cognitive psychology that studies memory processes.
memory board	The cognitive processes whereby past experience is remembered.
pile	A column of wood or steel or concrete that is driven into the ground to provide support for a structure. <i>He s making piles of money.</i>
provisions	A stipulated condition.
<u>quantity</u>	The figure or symbol representing a quantity. Many people like to buy in quantity .
