A **fat** rope.

fattish Somewhat fat.

fleshy Of or relating to or resembling flesh.

Fleshy greeny grey leaves.

forceful Forceful and definite in expression or action.

A **forceful** personality.

full of determination Containing as much or as many as is possible or normal.

hardy Having rugged physical strength; inured to fatigue or hardships.

Camels are tough and hardy creatures.

Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough

heavy work.

A **heavy** thundery sky.

Usually describes a large person who is fat but has a large frame to

overweight carry it.

Two of the top three **overweight** sectors in the US market.

Having a large or protruding belly.

A slightly **paunchy** balding middle aged man.

plump Sufficiently fat so as to have a pleasing fullness of figure.

robust Sturdy and strong in form, constitution, or construction.

A robust perennial.

roly-poly Short and plump.

rotund

Excessively fat.

The **rotund** and reverberating phrase.

Having a circular shape.

A **round** dozen.

solid Of good quality and condition solidly built.

Carved out of **solid** rock.

spirited Made lively or spirited.

A warm hearted generous **spirited** man.

Used especially of persons.

Stalwart

He remained a **stalwart** supporter of the cause.

Having a strong physiological or chemical effect.

Gave a **strong** pull on the rope.



tough

(of a person or their body) strongly and solidly built. **sturdy**

Sturdy canvas.

Of good quality and condition; solidly built. **substantial**

A row of **substantial** Victorian villas.

Feeling physical discomfort or pain tough is occasionally used

colloquially for bad.

The **tough** bottoms of his feet.

Characterized by forceful and energetic action or activity.

A tall **vigorous** and muscular man.




Usage Examples of "Stout" as an adjective

(especially of body tissue) used for the storage of fat. adipose

Adipose tissue constitutes the fat of meat.

Having or showing an extreme greed for wealth or material gain. avaricious

They are **avaricious** and will do anything for money.

Keen interest or enthusiasm. avidity

He read detective stories with avidity.

Grow bald lose hair on one s head. bald

The Nissan had two **bald** tyres.



belly A pig s belly as food especially as a traded commodity.

His fat **belly** stuck out over his trousers.

An insulating layer of fat under the skin of whales and other large marine

blubber mammals; used as a source of oil.

My six pack is quickly being covered in **blubber**.

buxom (of a female body) healthily plump and vigorous.

A generation ago **buxom** actresses were popular.

calorific Heat-generating.

There is fruit salad for those who can resist the more *calorific* concoctions.

Sufficiently fat so as to have a pleasing fullness of figure.

chubbyA pretty child with **chubby** cheeks.

Make or become fat.

She disliked **fat**ness in herself as well as in others.

fatty A fat person (often used as a nickname or form of address.

Fatty foods.

fleshy Of or relating to or resembling flesh.

Normally the tissue is **fleshy** pink.

gobble Use a large amount of (something) very quickly.

He **gobble**d up the rest of his sandwich.

heavy A thing such as a vehicle that is large or heavy of its kind.

A **heavy** line.

hypodermic A hypodermic syringe or injection.

Hypodermic needle.

nutritious Of or providing nourishment.

Home cooked burgers make a **nutritious** meal.

A hugely **obese** young man.

obesity The state of being grossly fat or overweight.
