Synonyms of "Stout" as an adjective (29 Words)

broad in the beam	Being at a peak or culminating point.
<u>chunky</u>	Short and thick; as e.g. having short legs and heavy musculature. <i>The dumplings were chunky pieces of uncooked dough.</i>
determined	Determined or decided upon as by an authority. <i>A struggle against a determined enemy.</i>
dummy	Short and plump. <i>A dummy little dumpling of a woman.</i>
<u>durable</u>	Existing for a long time. <i>Durable denim jeans.</i>

fat	Containing or composed of fat. <i>A fat rope.</i>
fattish	Somewhat fat.
fleshy	Of or relating to or resembling flesh. <i>Fleshy greeny grey leaves.</i>
forceful	Forceful and definite in expression or action. <i>A forceful personality.</i>
full of determination	Containing as much or as many as is possible or normal.
hardy	Having rugged physical strength; inured to fatigue or hardships. <i>Camels are tough and hardy creatures.</i>
heavy	Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough work. <i>A heavy thundery sky.</i>
overweight	Usually describes a large person who is fat but has a large frame to carry it. <i>Two of the top three overweight sectors in the US market.</i>
<u>paunchy</u>	Having a large or protruding belly. <i>A slightly paunchy balding middle aged man.</i>
<u>plump</u>	Sufficiently fat so as to have a pleasing fullness of figure. <i>Pleasingly plump.</i>
portly	Having a stout body; somewhat fat (used especially of a man). <i>A portly little man with a bowler hat.</i>
robust	Sturdy and strong in form, constitution, or construction. <i>A robust perennial.</i>
roly-poly	Short and plump.
rotund	Excessively fat. <i>The rotund and reverberating phrase.</i>
<u>round</u>	Having a circular shape. <i>A round dozen.</i>
<u>solid</u>	Of good quality and condition solidly built. <i>Carved out of solid rock.</i>
<u>spirited</u>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A warm hearted generous spirited man.</i>
<u>stalwart</u>	Used especially of persons. <i>He remained a stalwart supporter of the cause.</i>
strong	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>Gave a strong pull on the rope.</i>

sturdy

(of a person or their body) strongly and solidly built.

Sturdy canvas.

substantial

Of good quality and condition; solidly built.

A row of **substantial** Victorian villas.

tough

Feeling physical discomfort or pain tough is occasionally used colloquially for bad.

The **tough** bottoms of his feet.

vigorous

Characterized by forceful and energetic action or activity.

A tall **vigorous** and muscular man.



Usage Examples of "Stout" as an adjective

- Billy had armed himself with a stout stick.
- Stout middle-aged men.
- Stout hearts.
- Men are portly and women are stout.

- *He put up a stout defence in court.*
- *Stout seamen.*
- *Stout walking boots.*



Associations of "Stout" (30 Words)

adipose	(especially of body tissue) used for the storage of fat. <i>Adipose tissue constitutes the fat of meat.</i>
avaricious	Having or showing an extreme greed for wealth or material gain. <i>They are avaricious and will do anything for money.</i>
avidity	Keen interest or enthusiasm. <i>He read detective stories with avidity.</i>
bald	Grow bald lose hair on one's head. <i>The Nissan had two bald tyres.</i>

belly	A pig's belly as food especially as a traded commodity. <i>His fat belly stuck out over his trousers.</i>
blubber	An insulating layer of fat under the skin of whales and other large marine mammals; used as a source of oil. <i>My six pack is quickly being covered in blubber.</i>
buxom	(of a female body) healthily plump and vigorous. <i>A generation ago buxom actresses were popular.</i>
calorific	Heat-generating. <i>There is fruit salad for those who can resist the more calorific concoctions.</i>
chubby	Sufficiently fat so as to have a pleasing fullness of figure. <i>A pretty child with chubby cheeks.</i>
fat	Make or become fat. <i>She disliked fatness in herself as well as in others.</i>
fatty	A fat person (often used as a nickname or form of address). <i>Fatty foods.</i>
fleshy	Of or relating to or resembling flesh. <i>Normally the tissue is fleshy pink.</i>
gobble	Use a large amount of (something) very quickly. <i>He gobbled up the rest of his sandwich.</i>
heavy	A thing such as a vehicle that is large or heavy of its kind. <i>A heavy line.</i>
hypodermic	A hypodermic syringe or injection. <i>Hypodermic needle.</i>
nutritious	Of or providing nourishment. <i>Home cooked burgers make a nutritious meal.</i>
obese	Grossly fat or overweight. <i>A hugely obese young man.</i>
obesity	The state of being grossly fat or overweight. <i>The problem of obesity among children.</i>
overweight	Invest in (a market sector, industry, etc.) to a greater than normal degree. <i>An overweight lorry.</i>
paunch	Disembowel (an animal). <i>One of the things I had to do was to paunch and skin a hare.</i>
paunchy	Having a large or protruding belly. <i>A slightly paunchy balding middle aged man.</i>
plump	Make fat or plump. <i>We will plump out that poor starving child.</i>

portly	Having a stout body; somewhat fat (used especially of a man). <i>He was a man of portly presence.</i>
pudgy	Short and plump. <i>His pudgy fingers.</i>
robust	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>A robust body.</i>
rotund	Spherical in shape. <i>Her brother was slim where she was rotund.</i>
tubby	(of a sound) lacking resonance; dull (as that of a tub when struck). <i>A small tubby man.</i>
<u>vigorous</u>	Strong and active physically or mentally. <i>A tall vigorous and muscular man.</i>
