| accusative | The accusative case. <i>An accusative forefinger.</i> |
| bluff | The act of bluffing in poker deception by a false show of confidence in the strength of your cards. <i>The object is to bluff your opponent into submission.</i> |
| direct | Give directions to point somebody into a certain direction. <i>A direct descendant of Edward III.</i> |
| directly | At once; immediately. <i>I ll be back directly.</i> |
| firsthand | Received directly from a source. <i>Firsthand information.</i> |
| immediately | Bearing an immediate relation. <i>He answered immediately.</i> |
| intuition | An impression that something might be the case. <i>We shall allow our intuition to guide us.</i> |
| intuitive | Spontaneously derived from or prompted by a natural tendency. <i>His intuitive understanding of the readers real needs.</i> |
| lank | Of a person lanky. <i>Grown lank with fasting.</i> |
| lineal | Relating to or consisting of lines; linear. <i>A lineal descendant.</i> |
| linear | Able to be represented by a straight line on a graph. <i>Linear relationship.</i> |
| lineation | The division of text into lines. <i>Magnetic lineations.</i> |
| nonstop | Without stopping. <i>How many nonstops are there to Dallas.</i> |

| orthogonal | Not pertinent to the matter under consideration. <i>Wind and sea may displace the ship's center of gravity along three orthogonal axes.</i> |
| precipitous | Done with very great haste and without due deliberation- Shakespeare- Arthur Geddes. <i>A precipitous slide in the government's popularity.</i> |
| prescriptive | Pertaining to giving directives or rules. <i>A prescriptive grammar book.</i> |
| rectilinear | Contained by, consisting of, or moving in a straight line or lines. <i>The rectilinear propagation of light.</i> |
| risen | (of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i> |
| shortcut | A route shorter than the usual one. <i>They were taking a shortcut to town.</i> |
| soon | Early. <i>Everyone will soon know the truth.</i> |
| spindly | Weak or insubstantial in construction. <i>Spindly chairs.</i> |
| straightness | Trueness of course toward a goal. |
| supine | Offering no resistance- Theodore Roosevelt. <i>No other colony showed such supine selfish helplessness in allowing her own border citizens to be mercilessly harried.</i> |
| target | The location of the target that is to be hit. <i>The target of a manhunt.</i> |
| unilateral | Relating to or affecting only one side of an organ, the body, or another structure. <i>A unilateral decision.</i> |
| upright | An upright piano. <i>An upright vacuum cleaner.</i> |
| verbatim | Using exactly the same words. <i>Subjects were instructed to recall the passage verbatim.</i> |
| vertical | Something that is oriented vertically. <i>A column still vertical amid the ruins.</i> |
