## Associations of "Straight up" (30 Words)

<b>ascend</b>	(of a voice or sound) rise in pitch. <i>We had <b>ascended</b> 3 000 ft.</i>
<b>ascending</b>	Moving or going or growing upward. <i>The <b>ascending</b> staircase.</i>
<b>ascent</b>	A movement upward. <i>The first <b>ascent</b> of the Matterhorn.</i>
<b>boost</b>	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>The cut in interest rates will give a further <b>boost</b> to the economy.</i>
<b><u>climb</u></b>	A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>He <b>climbed</b> up the steps slowly.</i>
<b><u>climbing</u></b>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i><b>Climbing</b> equipment.</i>
<b><u>elevate</u></b>	Raise to a more important or impressive level. <i>The exercise will naturally <b>elevate</b> your chest and head.</i>
<b>elevator</b>	A shoe with a raised insole designed to make the wearer appear taller. <i><b>Elevators</b> of the upper lip.</i>
<b>escalator</b>	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
<b>high</b>	A high place. <i>Blurring the distinctions between <b>high</b> art and popular art.</i>
<b><u>hoist</u></b>	Raise or haul up with or as if with mechanical help. <i>She <b>hoisted</b> her backpack on to her shoulder.</i>
<b>ladder</b>	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>I <b>laddered</b> my tights as I arrived this morning.</i>
<b>lift</b>	An act of lifting. <i>The fog <b>lifted</b>.</i>

<b>mounting</b>	The action of mounting something. <i>The <b>mounting</b> of rapid fire guns.</i>
<b>precipitate</b>	A precipitated solid substance in suspension or after settling or filtering. <i>The bridge broke and <b>precipitated</b> the train into the river below.</i>
<b>precipitous</b>	(of an action) done suddenly and without careful consideration. <i><b>Precipitous</b> intervention.</i>
<b>raise</b>	Raise from a lower to a higher position. <i>He got a 3 <b>raise</b>.</i>
<b>rise</b>	Rise up. <i>The officer was a man of great courage who had <b>risen</b> from the ranks.</i>
<b>risen</b>	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>
<b>rising</b>	Going up, increasing, or sloping upward. <i>The Warsaw <b>rising</b> of 1944.</i>
<b>soar</b>	The act of rising upward into the air. <i>When she heard his voice her spirits <b>soared</b>.</i>
<b>soaring</b>	(of a bird) maintaining height in the air without flapping its wings. <i>The <b>soaring</b> crime rate.</i>
<b>stairs</b>	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
<b>stepladder</b>	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
<b>uphill</b>	Against difficulties. <i>He gave mountain biking clinics on handling steep <b>uphills</b>.</i>
<b>upstairs</b>	An upper floor. <i>An <b>upstairs</b> room.</i>
<b>upward</b>	Moving, pointing, or leading to a higher place, point, or level. <i>From childhood <b>upward</b>.</i>
<b>vertical</b>	A vertical line or plane. <i>The resort claims a <b>vertical</b> of 2 100 metres.</i>
<b>vertically</b>	At right angles to a horizontal plane; aligned in such a way that the top is directly above the bottom. <i>The bacteria are <b>vertically</b> transmitted from mother to offspring.</i>
<b>zoom</b>	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i><b>Zoom</b> out for a wide view of the garden again.</i>
