precipitate A precipitated solid substance in suspension or after settling or filtering.

The bridge broke and **precipitate**d the train into the river below.

(of an action) done suddenly and without careful consideration.

precipitous Precipitous intervention.

Raise from a lower to a higher position.

He got a 3 **raise**.

rise Rise up.

The officer was a man of great courage who had **rise**n from the ranks.

risen (of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon.

The **risen** sun.

rising Going up, increasing, or sloping upward.

The Warsaw **rising** of 1944.

The act of rising upward into the air.

When she heard his voice her spirits **soar**ed.

soaring (of a bird) maintaining height in the air without flapping its wings.

The **soaring** crime rate.

**stairs** A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.

**stepladder** A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.

**uphill** Against difficulties.

He gave mountain biking clinics on handling steep **uphill**s.

upstairs An upper floor.

An **upstairs** room.

**upward** Moving, pointing, or leading to a higher place, point, or level.

From childhood **upward**.

vertical A vertical line or plane.

The resort claims a **vertical** of 2 100 metres.

At right angles to a horizontal plane; aligned in such a way that the top is

**vertically** directly above the bottom.

The bacteria are **vertically** transmitted from mother to offspring.
