Associations of "Straight up" (30 Words)

ascend	(of a voice or sound) rise in pitch. <i>We had ascended 3 000 ft.</i>
ascending	Moving or going or growing upward. <i>The ascending staircase.</i>
ascent	A movement upward. <i>The first ascent of the Matterhorn.</i>
boost	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>The cut in interest rates will give a further boost to the economy.</i>
<u>climb</u>	A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>He climbed up the steps slowly.</i>
<u>climbing</u>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>Climbing equipment.</i>
<u>elevate</u>	Raise to a more important or impressive level. <i>The exercise will naturally elevate your chest and head.</i>
elevator	A shoe with a raised insole designed to make the wearer appear taller. <i>Elevators of the upper lip.</i>
escalator	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
high	A high place. <i>Blurring the distinctions between high art and popular art.</i>
<u>hoist</u>	Raise or haul up with or as if with mechanical help. <i>She hoisted her backpack on to her shoulder.</i>
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>I laddered my tights as I arrived this morning.</i>
lift	An act of lifting. <i>The fog lifted.</i>

mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>The mounting of rapid fire guns.</i>
precipitate	A precipitated solid substance in suspension or after settling or filtering. <i>The bridge broke and precipitated the train into the river below.</i>
precipitous	(of an action) done suddenly and without careful consideration. <i>Precipitous intervention.</i>
raise	Raise from a lower to a higher position. <i>He got a 3 raise.</i>
rise	Rise up. <i>The officer was a man of great courage who had risen from the ranks.</i>
risen	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i>
rising	Going up, increasing, or sloping upward. <i>The Warsaw rising of 1944.</i>
soar	The act of rising upward into the air. <i>When she heard his voice her spirits soared.</i>
soaring	(of a bird) maintaining height in the air without flapping its wings. <i>The soaring crime rate.</i>
stairs	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
stepladder	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
uphill	Against difficulties. <i>He gave mountain biking clinics on handling steep uphills.</i>
upstairs	An upper floor. <i>An upstairs room.</i>
upward	Moving, pointing, or leading to a higher place, point, or level. <i>From childhood upward.</i>
vertical	A vertical line or plane. <i>The resort claims a vertical of 2 100 metres.</i>
vertically	At right angles to a horizontal plane; aligned in such a way that the top is directly above the bottom. <i>The bacteria are vertically transmitted from mother to offspring.</i>
zoom	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>Zoom out for a wide view of the garden again.</i>
