(especially of a task) not demanding.


undemanding Simple undemanding affection.

A statement or principle having general rather than specific validity or

generality force.

limpid

His service was better than that offered by the **generality** of doctors.

(of language) transparently clear; easily understandable.

The **limpid** waters of the Caribbean.

lucid Bright or luminous.

A lucid account.

obvious Predictable and lacking in subtlety.

It was an **obvious** remark to make.

pellucid Translucently clear.

Mountains reflected in the **pellucid** waters.

perspicuous (of language) transparently clear; easily understandable.
