## Stranded as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Stranded" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “stranded” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a boat, sailor, or sea creature) left aground on a shore.*
- *Left without the means to move from somewhere.*
- *Cut off or left behind.*



## Synonyms of "Stranded" as an adjective (8 Words)

<b>beached</b>	Hauled up or stranded on a beach. <i>A <b>beached</b> whale.</i>
<b>grounded</b>	Well balanced and sensible. <i>For someone so young Chris is extremely <b>grounded</b>.</i>
<b>helpless</b>	Unable to function; without help. <i>Lying ill and <b>helpless</b>.</i>
<b>high and dry</b>	Happy and excited and energetic.
<b>in difficulties</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b>isolated</b>	Marked by separation of or from usually contiguous elements. <i>Tiny <b>isolated</b> villages remote from centers of civilization.</i>
<b>marooned</b>	Cut off or left behind. <i>Travelers <b>marooned</b> by the blizzard.</i>
<b>stuck</b>	Caught or fixed. <i>This problem has me completely <b>stuck</b>.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Stranded" as an adjective

- *Several stranded fish in a tide pool.*
- *A stranded whale.*
- *She offers a lift to a stranded commuter.*





## Associations of "Stranded" (30 Words)

<b>braided</b>	(of hair) formed into a braid or braids. <i>A <b>braided</b> river carries an enormous burden of sand and gravel.</i>
<b>cable</b>	Fasten with a cable. <i>Nearly all urban areas are <b>cabled</b> so viewers can choose from up to 20 channels.</i>
<b>cashmere</b>	Woollen material made from or resembling cashmere. <i>A <b>cashmere</b> jumper.</i>
<b>cocoon</b>	Wrap in or as if in a cocoon as for protection. <i>The moth emerged from its pale yellow papery <b>cocoon</b>.</i>
<b>cord</b>	A length of cord. <i>The baby was still attached to its mother by the <b>cord</b>.</i>
<b>cotton</b>	Thread made of cotton fibers. <i>A white <b>cotton</b> blouse.</i>

<b>crochet</b>	Make a garment or piece of fabric using crochet. <i><b>Crochet</b> a bedspread.</i>
<b>doff</b>	Remove (an item of clothing). <i>The manager <b>doffed</b> his hat to her.</i>
<b>fibre</b>	A substance formed of fibres. <i>A weak person with no moral <b>fibre</b>.</i>
<b>fibrosis</b>	The thickening and scarring of connective tissue, usually as a result of injury.
<b>fleece</b>	A jacket or other garment made from a fleece fabric. <i>The sky was half blue half <b>fleeced</b> with white clouds.</i>
<b>floss</b>	Clean between one's teeth with dental floss. <i><b>Floss</b> your teeth after every meal.</i>
<b>fur</b>	Animal skin with fur on it or fabric resembling this used in making or trimming garments. <i><b>Fur</b> or scale not just in kettles but in other hidden parts of the hot water system.</i>
<b>hair</b>	Cloth woven from horsehair or camelhair used for upholstery or stiffening in garments. <i>Thick black <b>hairs</b> on his huge arms.</i>
<b>hank</b>	A coil or skein of wool, hair, or other material. <i>A thick <b>hank</b> of her blonde hair.</i>
<b>hawser</b>	A thick rope or cable for mooring or towing a ship.
<b>knitting</b>	The craft or action of knitting. <i>I put down my <b>knitting</b>.</i>
<b>mohair</b>	A yarn or fabric made from mohair typically mixed with wool. <i>A <b>mohair</b> sweater.</i>
<b>needle</b>	Prick with a needle. <i>A darning <b>needle</b>.</i>
<b>ply</b>	One of several layers of cloth or paper or wood as in plywood. <i><b>Ply</b> an axe.</i>
<b>rope</b>	Fasten with a rope. <i>Coils of <b>rope</b>.</i>
<b>silk</b>	Thread or fabric made from the fibre produced by the silkworm. <i>Some were dressed in racing <b>silks</b>.</i>
<b>string</b>	The stringed instruments in an orchestra. <i>She wore a <b>string</b> of agates round her throat.</i>
<b>tapestry</b>	Something that resembles a tapestry in its complex pictorial designs. <i>Motifs and compositions used in Indian <b>tapestry</b>.</i>



**thread**

Pass a thread through the eye of a needle or through the needle and guides of a sewing machine.

**Thread** the buttons on to a length of cotton.

**twine**

Wind or cause to wind round something.

**Twine** a rope.

**weave**

Include an element in (a story or pattern).

Trailers show him with dyed blond hair and in one scene a flowing blond **weave**.

**wire**

Provide fasten or reinforce with wires.

An undercover police informer who was wearing a **wire**.

**wool**

Yarn or textile fibre made from wool.

Carpets made of 80 per cent **wool** and 20 per cent nylon.

**yarn**

Tell or spin a yarn.

He never let reality get in the way of a good **yarn**.
