Definitions of "Strangeness" as a noun

- *The quality of being alien or not native.*

- *A characteristic property of certain subatomic particles (specifically strange quarks, strange antiquarks, and hadrons containing these), expressed as a quantum number.*
- *Unusualness as a consequence of not being well known.*
- *(physics) one of the six flavors of quark.*



Synonyms of "Strangeness" as a noun (19 Words)

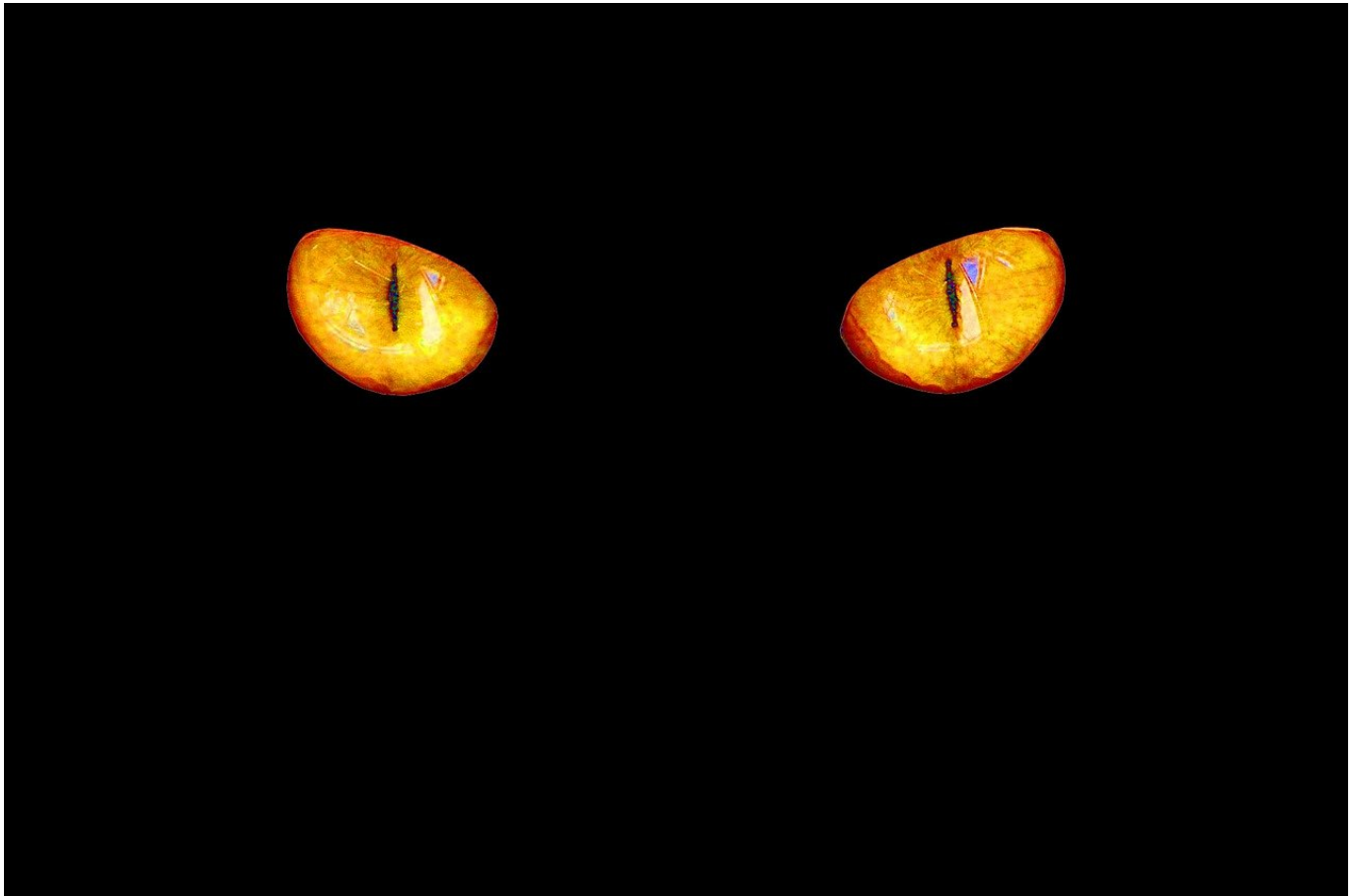
abnormality	An abnormal physical condition resulting from defective genes or developmental deficiencies. <i>Miscarriage can be caused by fetal abnormality.</i>
atypicality	The quality of not being representative of a type, group, or class. <i>We would stress the atypicality of the presentation.</i>
bizarreness	Strikingly out of the ordinary.
curiousness	The quality of being alien or not native.
eccentricity	A ratio describing the shape of a conic section; the ratio of the distance between the foci to the length of the major axis. <i>A circle is an ellipse with zero eccentricity.</i>
foreignness	The quality of being alien or not native.
incongruity	The quality of disagreeing; being unsuitable and inappropriate. <i>The incongruity of his fleshy face and skinny body disturbed her.</i>
incongruousness	The quality of disagreeing; being unsuitable and inappropriate.
irregularity	A thing that is irregular in form or nature. <i>There is evidence that fraud and irregularity continue on a large scale.</i>
oddity	A strange or peculiar person or thing. <i>She was regarded as a bit of an oddity.</i>
oddness	The parity of odd numbers (not divisible by two).
outlandishness	Strikingly out of the ordinary.

peculiarity	A characteristic that is distinctive of a particular person or place. <i>His essays characterized decency as a British peculiarity.</i>
queerness	The state or condition of being strange. <i>The queerness of it gave me a kind of fright.</i>
singularity	Strangeness by virtue of being remarkable or unusual. <i>Maybe the singularity just happened and we didn't notice.</i>
unexpectedness	Extraordinariness by virtue of being unexpected. <i>The unexpectedness of the warm welcome.</i>
<u>unfamiliarity</u>	The quality of not being known or recognized. <i>Her unfamiliarity with the area results in her getting lost.</i>
unusualness	Uncommonness by virtue of being unusual.
weirdness	Strikingly out of the ordinary. <i>The photos show the extreme weirdness of the objects.</i>

Associations of "Strangeness" (30 Words)

abnormal	Departing from the normal in e.g. intelligence and development. <i>Abnormal profits.</i>
abnormality	Behavior that breaches the rule or etiquette or custom or morality. <i>Miscarriage can be caused by fetal abnormality.</i>
<u>anomaly</u>	Deviation from the normal or common order or form or rule. <i>The position abounds in anomaly.</i>
awkward	Lacking grace or skill in manner or movement or performance. <i>An awkward pause followed his remark.</i>
bizarre	Conspicuously or grossly unconventional or unusual. <i>A bizarre situation.</i>

deviation	The amount by which a single measurement differs from a fixed value such as the mean. <i>Deviations from Standard English.</i>
eccentric	A person of a specified kind usually with many eccentricities. <i>A friendly eccentric.</i>
eccentricity	A measure of the extent of deviation from circularity. <i>A circle is an ellipse with zero eccentricity.</i>
eerie	Suggestive of the supernatural; mysterious. <i>An uncomfortable and eerie stillness in the woods.</i>
exotic	An exotic plant or animal. <i>Exotic cuisine.</i>
foible	A behavioral attribute that is distinctive and peculiar to an individual. <i>They have to tolerate each other's little foibles.</i>
grotesque	Art characterized by an incongruous mixture of parts of humans and animals interwoven with plants. <i>A figure wearing a grotesque mask.</i>
maverick	An unbranded range animal (especially a stray calf); belongs to the first person who puts a brand on it. <i>He's the maverick of the senate.</i>
mysterious	(of a person) deliberately enigmatic. <i>She was mysterious about herself but said plenty about her husband.</i>
odd	Of the remaining member of a pair. <i>She looked younger than her fifty odd years.</i>
oddity	A strange attitude or habit. <i>Realizing the oddity of the remark he retracted it.</i>
offbeat	(informal) strikingly unconventional. <i>A rapid tempo is essential here otherwise we will not sense the offbeat hemiolas.</i>
outlandish	Conspicuously or grossly unconventional or unusual. <i>Three wise outlandish kings.</i>
peculiar	Belonging exclusively to. <i>The peculiar character of the Government of the U S.</i>
quaint	Strange in an interesting or pleasing way. <i>Quaint country cottages.</i>
quirk	(with reference to a person's mouth or eyebrow) move or twist suddenly, especially to express surprise or amusement. <i>A strange quirk of fate had led her to working for Nathan.</i>

surreal	Having the qualities of surrealism bizarre. <i>As irrational and surreal as a dream.</i>
uncanny	Suggesting the operation of supernatural influences- John Galsworthy. <i>An uncanny feeling that she was being watched.</i>
uncommon	Marked by an uncommon quality especially superlative or extreme of its kind. <i>Doing an uncommon amount of business.</i>
unearthly	Concerned with or affecting the spirit or soul. <i>Unearthly quiet.</i>
unprecedented	Never done or known before. <i>An unprecedented expansion in population and industry.</i>
unusual	Remarkable or interesting because different from or better than others. <i>A scene of unusual beauty.</i>
weird	Suggesting the operation of supernatural influences. <i>Some trick of the moonlight some weird effect of shadow.</i>
zany	A zany person. <i>His zany humour.</i>
