## Stranger as a Noun

### Definitions of "Stranger" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “stranger” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A person entirely unaccustomed to (a feeling, experience, or situation.*
- *A person who does not know, or is not known in, a particular place or community.*
- *Anyone who does not belong in the environment in which they are found.*
- *An individual that one is not acquainted with.*
- *A person who is not a member or official of the House of Commons.*
- *A person whom one does not know or with whom one is not familiar.*



## Synonyms of "Stranger" as a noun (7 Words)

<b>alien</b>	A plant or animal species originally introduced from another country and later naturalized. <i>She discovers that the <b>alien</b> s spaceship has crashed.</i>
<b>incomer</b>	A person who has come to live in an area in which they have not grown up, especially in a close-knit rural community. <i>An English <b>incomer</b> to Orkney.</i>
<a href="#"><u>newcomer</u></a>	A person who has recently arrived in a place. <i>A <b>newcomer</b> to federal politics.</i>
<b>unknown</b>	An unknown person or thing. <i>She is a relative <b>unknown</b>.</i>
<b>unknown person</b>	Anyone who does not belong in the environment in which they are found.
<b>unpractised in</b>	A rare soft silvery metallic element; occurs in small quantities in sphalerite.
<b>unversed in</b>	A unit of length equal to one twelfth of a foot.



## Usage Examples of "Stranger" as a noun

- *Don't talk to strangers.*
- *He must have been a stranger to the village.*
- *He is no stranger to controversy.*
- *She remained a stranger to him.*
- *I'm a stranger in these parts.*





## Associations of "Stranger" (30 Words)

<b>alien</b>	Supposedly from another world; extraterrestrial. <i>Principles that are <b>alien</b> to them.</i>
<b><u>ambassador</u></b>	An accredited diplomat sent by a state as its permanent representative in a foreign country. <i>An <b>ambassador</b> of good will.</i>
<b><u>barbarian</u></b>	Relating to ancient barbarians. <i>The city was besieged by the <b>barbarians</b>.</i>
<b>consul</b>	A diplomat appointed by a government to protect its commercial interests and help its citizens in a foreign country. <i>The British <b>consul</b> in Israel.</i>
<b>customs</b>	The place at a port, airport, or frontier where officials check incoming goods, travellers, or luggage. <i>We were through <b>customs</b> with a minimum of formalities.</i>
<b>dignitary</b>	A person considered to be important because of high rank or office. <i>I presented bouquets to visiting dignitaries at my prep school.</i>
<b>diplomacy</b>	Wisdom in the management of public affairs. <i>With perfect <b>diplomacy</b> he divided his attention between Meryl and Anthea.</i>

<b>diplomat</b>	A person who can deal with others in a sensitive and tactful way.
<b>diplomatic</b>	Relating to or characteristic of diplomacy. <i><b>Diplomatic</b> relations with Britain were broken.</i>
<b>diplomatist</b>	An official engaged in international negotiations.
<b><u>dissimilar</u></b>	Marked by dissimilarity. <i>Their understanding of the world is not so <b>dissimilar</b> from our own.</i>
<b>embassy</b>	The staff working in an embassy. <i>The <b>embassy</b> denied any involvement in the murder.</i>
<b>emigrate</b>	Leave one's country of residence for a new one. <i>Rose's parents <b>emigrated</b> to Australia.</i>
<b>emigration</b>	Migration from a place (especially migration from your native country in order to settle in another). <i>Mass <b>emigration</b> from Ireland to the United States.</i>
<b>exotic</b>	An exotic plant or animal. <i>An <b>exotic</b> hair style.</i>
<b>expatriate</b>	A person who lives outside their native country. <i>Money found to have been <b>expatriated</b> to Singapore banks.</i>
<b>extraneous</b>	Not belonging to that in which it is contained; introduced from an outside source. <i>The ballet struck me as <b>extraneous</b> and somewhat out of keeping with the rest of the play.</i>
<b><u>extrinsic</u></b>	Not forming an essential part of a thing or arising or originating from the outside. <i>That style is something <b>extrinsic</b> to the subject.</i>
<b><u>foreign</u></b>	Coming or introduced from outside. <i>The mysticism so <b>foreign</b> to the French mind and temper.</i>
<b>foreigner</b>	A person who comes from a foreign country; someone who does not owe allegiance to your country.
<b>frenchman</b>	A person of French nationality.
<b><u>immigration</u></b>	Migration into a place (especially migration to a country of which you are not a native in order to settle there). <i>The increased <b>immigration</b> strengthened the colony.</i>
<b>nonnative</b>	Not being or composed of aborigines. <i>Our large <b>nonnative</b> population.</i>
<b><u>outsider</u></b>	A person who does not belong to a particular organization or profession. <i>To the <b>outsider</b> glitzy fashion shows may seem an outrageous extravagance.</i>

<b>overseas</b>	In a place across an ocean. <i>He lived <b>overseas</b> for many years.</i>
<b>spaniard</b>	A native or inhabitant of Spain.
<u><b>tour</b></u>	Make a tour of an area. <i>He decided to <b>tour</b> France.</i>
<u><b>traveler</b></u>	A person who changes location.
<u><b>unrelated</b></u>	Not related or linked. <i><b>Unrelated</b> facts.</i>
<b>world</b>	A particular period of history. <i>It s a wonderful <b>world</b>.</i>
