Tough street gangs.

Extremely irritating to the nerves. trying

It had been a very **trying** day.

- Corporate finance work can be stressful.
- The stressful days before a war.





Associations of "Stressful" (30 Words)

aching Arousing, experiencing, or expressive of intense sorrow or longing.

An aching sense of loss.

agonizing Causing great physical or mental pain.

There is an **agonizing** choice to make.

biting Capable of wounding.

A cream to ward off **biting** insects.

Form a callus or calluses.

The exposed surface will quickly form healing **callus**.

Consisting of many interconnecting parts or elements; intricate.

complicated A complicated problem.

daunting Seeming difficult to deal with in prospect; intimidating.

A **daunting** task.



Flooding caused by a tumultuous breakup of ice in a river during the spring

debacle or summer.

The only man to reach double figures in the second innings **debacle**.

defeated People who are defeated.

The **defeated** enemy.

disappointed (of hopes or expectations) prevented from being realized.

Thousands of **disappointed** customers were kept waiting.

Causing someone to lose confidence or enthusiasm; depressing.

discouraging Where never is heard a **discouraging** word.

disillusioned Freed from illusion.

The minority groups were completely **disillusioned** with the party.

distressing Causing anxiety, sorrow or pain; upsetting. Some very **distressing** news.

Expressing sorrow; mournful.

dolefulHe could be struck off with **doleful** consequences.

excruciating Extremely painful.

He explained the procedure in **excruciating** detail.

foiled Disappointingly unsuccessful.

Their **foiled** attempt to capture Calais.

frustrating Discouraging by hindering.

It can be very **frustrating** to find that the size you want isn t there.

intimidating Having a frightening, overawing, or threatening effect. *The intimidating defence barrister*.

irksome Irritating; annoying.

Petty regulations were becoming very **irksome**.

mournful Expressing sorrow.

Stared with **mournful** eyes.

painful Causing physical pain. *A painful performance.*

Poignant Keenly distressing to the mind or feelings. **Poignant** grief cannot endure forever.

of things that make you feel sad Christina Rossetti.

A **sad** day for us all.

sore Causing misery or pain or distress. *He was sore from the long ride.*

sorrowful Causing grief. **Sorrowful** news.



tedious

Too long, slow, or dull; tiresome or monotonous.

A **tedious** journey. Extremely painful.

torturous

A torturous five days of fitness training.

Difficult or annoying; hard to endure.

trying Fell upon trying times.

unfulfilled Not having fully utilized or exploited one's abilities or character.

Unfulfilled and uneasy men.

unhappy Causing discomfort.

Had an **unhappy** time at school.

unsatisfied Not having been satisfied.The compromise left all sides unsatisfied.
