## Associations of "Strewn" (30 Words)

<a href="#">asunder</a>	Widely separated especially in space. <i>Those whom God hath joined together let no man put <b>asunder</b>.</i>
<a href="#">circulate</a>	Move through a space, circuit or system, returning to the starting point. <i>She <b>circulates</b> among royalty.</i>
<a href="#">diffuse</a>	Spread or diffuse through. <i>A large <b>diffuse</b> organization.</i>
<a href="#">diffusion</a>	The action of spreading the light from a light source evenly to reduce glare and harsh shadows. <i>The <b>diffusion</b> of knowledge.</i>
<a href="#">dispel</a>	To cause to separate and go in different directions. <i><b>Dispel</b> doubts.</i>
<b>dispersal</b>	The splitting up of a group of people, causing them to leave in different directions. <i><b>Dispersal</b> of pollen by the wind.</i>
<b>disperse</b>	Denoting a phase dispersed in another phase as in a colloid. <i>The crowds <b>dispersed</b>.</i>
<b>dispersed</b>	Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. <i>Has ties with many widely <b>dispersed</b> friends.</i>
<a href="#">dispersion</a>	The action or process of distributing things or people over a wide area. <i>The <b>dispersion</b> of the troops.</i>
<a href="#">disseminate</a>	Spread throughout an organ or the body. <i>There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can <b>disseminate</b> and migrate.</i>
<b>dissemination</b>	The act of dispersing or diffusing something. <i>The <b>dissemination</b> of public information.</i>
<b>dissipate</b>	(with reference to a feeling or emotion) disappear or cause to disappear. <i>The concern she d felt for him had wholly <b>dissipated</b>.</i>

<b>dissolution</b>	The action or process of dissolving or being dissolved. <i>The <b>dissolution</b> of their marriage.</i>
<b>diversify</b>	Make or become more diverse or varied. <i>New plants will <b>diversify</b> the habitat.</i>
<b>effluence</b>	The process of flowing out.
<b>imbue</b>	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably <b>imbued</b> with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
<b>intersperse</b>	Place at intervals in or among. <i>Deep pools <b>interspersed</b> by shallow shingle banks.</i>
<b>perfuse</b>	Permeate or suffuse with a liquid, colour, or quality. <i>The yellow light is <b>perfused</b> with white.</i>
<b>pervasiveness</b>	The quality of filling or spreading throughout. <i>The <b>pervasiveness</b> of the odor of cabbage in tenement hallways.</i>
<b>petal</b>	Each of the segments of the corolla of a flower, which are modified leaves and are typically coloured.
<b>proliferate</b>	(of a cell, structure, or organism) reproduce rapidly. <i>Pizza parlors <b>proliferate</b> in this area.</i>
<b>proliferation</b>	Growth by the rapid multiplication of parts. <i>The <b>proliferation</b> of nuclear weapons.</i>
<b>prolix</b>	(of speech or writing) using or containing too many words; tediously lengthy. <i>He found the narrative too <b>prolix</b> and discursive.</i>
<b>scatter</b>	Sow by scattering. <i>A <b>scatter</b> of boulders round the pothole mouth.</i>
<b>scattered</b>	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>With so much on her plate however she can be a bit <b>scattered</b>.</i>
<b>shed</b>	Shed at an early stage of development. <i>The buses were temporarily <b>shedded</b> in that depot.</i>
<b>spray</b>	An act of spraying something. <i>The truck shuddered to a halt <b>spraying</b> gravel from under its wheels.</i>
<b>spread</b>	A bedspread. <i>His mother laid on a huge <b>spread</b>.</i>
<b>sprinkle</b>	Rain very lightly. <i>A dress with little daisies <b>sprinkled</b> all over it.</i>
<b>suffuse</b>	Gradually spread through or over. <i>The sky was <b>suffused</b> with a warm pink color.</i>
