<u>noticeable</u>	Undesirably noticeable. <i>Noticeable for its vivid historical background.</i>
obvious	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. <i>Obvious errors.</i>
outstanding	Clearly noticeable. <i>An outstanding fact of our time is that nations poisoned by anti semitism proved less fortunate in regard to their own freedom.</i>
<u>picturesque</u>	(of a place or building) visually attractive, especially in a quaint or charming way. <i>Ruined abbeys and picturesque villages.</i>
prepossessing	Creating a favorable impression. <i>He was not a prepossessing sight.</i>
<u>pretty</u>	(of a thing) pleasing to the eye or the ear. <i>Pretty song.</i>
prominent	Projecting from something; protuberant. <i>A prominent citizen.</i>
