- With clothing stripped off.






Synonyms of "Stripped" as an adjective (2 Words)






Usage Examples of "Stripped" as an adjective

Associations of "Stripped" (30 Words)

bald	Grow bald lose hair on one s head. A bald pate.
<u>bare</u>	Lay bare. <i>You are bare lazy.</i>
belt	A conveyor belt. She belt ed him over the head with her racquet.
decompression	A gradual reduction of air pressure on a person who has been experiencing high pressure while diving. <i>This disk contains a number of utilities which require decompression.</i>
denudation	The removal of covering.
denude	Lay bare. Almost overnight the Arctic was denude d of animals.
<u>deprive</u>	Take away possessions from someone. The city was deprive d of its water supplies.
<u>diffusion</u>	The spread of social institutions (and myths and skills) from one society to another. The rate of diffusion of a gas.
<u>disenfranchise</u>	Deprive (someone) of the rights and privileges of a free inhabitant of a borough, city, or country. The law disenfranchise d some 3 000 voters on the basis of a residence qualification.
disrobe	Take off official vestments or regalia. Kate remembers being disrobe d.
divest	Rid oneself of (a business interest or investment. The board of trustees divest ed 20 million in real estate property.
<u>expose</u>	Expose while ridiculing especially of pretentious or false claims and ideas. <i>At low tide the sands are exposed.</i>
exposed	With no protection or shield. Equity investors are perhaps the most exposed .
impoverish	Exhaust the strength or vitality of. The wars had impoverish ed him.
leach	The process of leaching. Ash is readily leach ed.
loosen	Make less severe or strict. <i>He wanted to strengthen rather than loosen union links.</i>



peel	Remove (the outer covering or skin) from a fruit or vegetable. Pieces of potato peel .
percolate	Spread gradually. <i>Percolate</i> coffee.
<u>permeate</u>	Pass through. His personality has begun to permeate through the whole organization.
rob	Rip off; ask an unreasonable price. Hughes rob bed Vonk yards inside the City half.
unaided	Needing or having no assistance; without help. His first unaided walk through the park.
<u>undo</u>	Deprive of certain characteristics. Iago s hatred of women undo es him.
undress	Get undressed. Women in various states of undress .
unfasten	Open the fastening of; undo (something. Unfasten your belt.
unpainted	Not painted. An unpainted house.
untie	Cause to become loose. They untie d the prisoner.
unwrap	Remove the wrapping from (a package. Unwrap the evidence in the murder case.
<u>usurp</u>	Seize and take control without authority and possibly with force; take as one's right or possession. The Church had usurp ed upon the domain of the state.
