## Associations of "Strong willed" (30 Words)

<b>durability</b>	The ability to withstand wear, pressure, or damage. <i>They advertised the <b>durability</b> of their products.</i>
<b> durable</b>	(of a person) having endurance. <i>The <b>perdurable</b> granite of the ancient Appalachian spine of the continent.</i>
<b> emphatic</b>	An emphatic consonant. <i>The document contained a particularly <b>emphatic</b> guarantee of religious liberty.</i>
<b> endurance</b>	The power to withstand hardship or stress. <i>The annual 24 hour <b>endurance</b> race.</i>
<b> fortified</b>	(of food) having had vitamins or other supplements added so as to increase the nutritional value. <i>A <b>fortified</b> manor house.</i>
<b> gusty</b>	Having or showing gusto. <i><b>Gusty</b> female vocals.</i>
<b> hard</b>	Unfortunate or hard to bear. <i>A <b>hard</b> drinker.</i>
<b> hardheaded</b>	Guided by practical experience and observation rather than theory. <i>A <b>hardheaded</b> appraisal of our position.</i>
<b> inflexible</b>	Resistant to being bent. <i>Heavy <b>inflexible</b> armour.</i>
<b> ossify</b>	Cause to become hard and bony. <i>These tracheal cartilages may <b>ossify</b>.</i>
<b> reinforce</b>	Make stronger. <i>Let s <b>reinforce</b> good behavior.</i>
<b> resolute</b>	Firm in purpose or belief; characterized by firmness and determination. <i>A <b>resolute</b> and unshakeable faith.</i>

<b>rigid</b>	A lorry which is not articulated. <b>Rigid</b> bureaucratic controls.
<b>rigidness</b>	The quality of being rigid and rigorously severe.
<b>rigour</b>	Something hard to endure. <i>His analysis is lacking in <b>rigour</b>.</i>
<b>robust</b>	(of a system, organization, etc.) able to withstand or overcome adverse conditions. <i>A <b>robust</b> mixture of fish onions capers and tomatoes.</i>
<b>solid</b>	A substance or object that is solid rather than liquid or fluid. <b>Solid</b> color.
<b>stalwart</b>	Used especially of persons. <i>A <b>stalwart</b> supporter of the UN.</i>
<b>steadfast</b>	Firm and dependable especially in loyalty. <b>Steadfast</b> loyalty.
<b>strength</b>	Physical energy or intensity. <i>We faced an army of great <b>strength</b>.</i>
<b>stubborn</b>	Having or showing dogged determination not to change one's attitude or position on something, especially in spite of good arguments or reasons to do so. <i>A <b>stubborn</b> refusal to learn from experience.</i>
<b>sturdy</b>	Showing confidence and determination. <b>Sturdy</b> young athletes.
<b>tough</b>	Feeling physical discomfort or pain tough is occasionally used colloquially for bad. <i>A <b>tough</b> all weather fabric.</i>
<b>uncompromising</b>	Not making concessions. <b>Uncompromising</b> honesty.
<b>undismayed</b>	Unshaken in purpose. <i>Wholly <b>undismayed</b> by the commercial failure of the three movies he had made.</i>
<b>unshaken</b>	Unshaken in purpose. <i>Their trust in him remained <b>unshaken</b>.</i>
<b>unwavering</b>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <b>Unwavering</b> loyalty.
<b>unyielding</b>	Stubbornly unyielding. <i>An <b>unyielding</b> head support.</i>

**vigorous**

Characterized by forceful and energetic action or activity.

*Gave her skirt a **vigorous** shake.*

**virile**

Having strength, energy, and a strong sex drive (typically used of a man).

*A strong **virile** performance of the Mass.*
