| emphatic | An emphatic consonant. <i>The document contained a particularly emphatic guarantee of religious liberty.</i> |
| endurance | The power to withstand hardship or stress. <i>The annual 24 hour endurance race.</i> |
| fortified | (of food) having had vitamins or other supplements added so as to increase the nutritional value. <i>A fortified manor house.</i> |
| gusty | Having or showing gusto. <i>Gusty female vocals.</i> |
| hard | Unfortunate or hard to bear. <i>A hard drinker.</i> |
| hardheaded | Guided by practical experience and observation rather than theory. <i>A hardheaded appraisal of our position.</i> |
| inflexible | Resistant to being bent. <i>Heavy inflexible armour.</i> |
| ossify | Cause to become hard and bony. <i>These tracheal cartilages may ossify.</i> |
| reinforce | Make stronger. <i>Let s reinforce good behavior.</i> |
| resolute | Firm in purpose or belief; characterized by firmness and determination. <i>A resolute and unshakeable faith.</i> |

| rigid | A lorry which is not articulated. Rigid bureaucratic controls. |
| rigidness | The quality of being rigid and rigorously severe. |
| rigour | Something hard to endure. <i>His analysis is lacking in rigour.</i> |
| robust | (of a system, organization, etc.) able to withstand or overcome adverse conditions. <i>A robust mixture of fish onions capers and tomatoes.</i> |
| solid | A substance or object that is solid rather than liquid or fluid. Solid color. |
| stalwart | Used especially of persons. <i>A stalwart supporter of the UN.</i> |
| steadfast | Firm and dependable especially in loyalty. Steadfast loyalty. |
| strength | Physical energy or intensity. <i>We faced an army of great strength.</i> |
| stubborn | Having or showing dogged determination not to change one's attitude or position on something, especially in spite of good arguments or reasons to do so. <i>A stubborn refusal to learn from experience.</i> |
| sturdy | Showing confidence and determination. Sturdy young athletes. |
| tough | Feeling physical discomfort or pain tough is occasionally used colloquially for bad. <i>A tough all weather fabric.</i> |
| uncompromising | Not making concessions. Uncompromising honesty. |
| undismayed | Unshaken in purpose. <i>Wholly undismayed by the commercial failure of the three movies he had made.</i> |
| unshaken | Unshaken in purpose. <i>Their trust in him remained unshaken.</i> |
| unwavering | Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. Unwavering loyalty. |
| unyielding | Stubbornly unyielding. <i>An unyielding head support.</i> |

vigorous

Characterized by forceful and energetic action or activity.

*Gave her skirt a **vigorous** shake.*

virile

Having strength, energy, and a strong sex drive (typically used of a man).

*A strong **virile** performance of the Mass.*
