## Associations of "Strung out meaning" (30 Words)

<a href="#">connotation</a>	The abstract meaning or intension of a term, which forms a principle determining which objects or concepts it applies to. <i>The work functions both by analogy and by <b>connotation</b>.</i>
<b>context</b>	The set of facts or circumstances that surround a situation or event. <i>The proposals need to be considered in the <b>context</b> of new European directives.</i>
<a href="#">cryptic</a>	Of an obscure nature. <i><b>Cryptic</b> plumage is thought to minimize predation.</i>
<b>dah</b>	The longer of the two telegraphic signals used in Morse code.
<a href="#">decipher</a>	Convert code into ordinary language. <i>Visual signals help us <b>decipher</b> what is being communicated.</i>
<b>denotation</b>	The act of indicating or pointing out by name. <i>Beyond their immediate <b>denotation</b> the words have a connotative power.</i>
<b>egyptian</b>	Of or relating to or characteristic of Egypt or its people or their language.
<b>endearment</b>	Love or affection. <i>A term of <b>endearment</b>.</i>
<a href="#">entail</a>	A property bequeathed under an entail. <i>A situation which <b>entails</b> considerable risks.</i>
<b>exclude</b>	Prevent from entering; shut out. <i>One cannot <b>exclude</b> the possibility of a fall in house prices.</i>
<a href="#">exhale</a>	Breathe out. <i>The chimney <b>exhales</b> a thick smoke.</i>
<a href="#">extrinsic</a>	Not forming an essential part of a thing or arising or originating from the outside. <i>A complex interplay of <b>extrinsic</b> and intrinsic factors.</i>
<b>figurative</b>	Departing from a literal use of words; metaphorical. <i>The <b>figurative</b> art of the humanistic tradition.</i>

<b>glyph</b>	A hieroglyphic character or symbol. <i>Flanges painted with esoteric <b>glyphs</b>.</i>
<b>hieroglyph</b>	Writing that resembles hieroglyphics usually by being illegible. <i><b>Hieroglyphs</b> describing the Mayan calendar.</i>
<b>home</b>	At or to or in the direction of one's home or family. <i>The growth in <b>home</b> ownership.</i>
<b><u>import</u></b>	Sales of imported goods or services or the revenue from such sales. <i>The lead role was played by an <b>import</b> from Sweden.</i>
<b>indication</b>	Something (as a course of action) that is indicated as expedient or necessary. <i>An <b>indication</b> of foul play.</i>
<b><u>interpret</u></b>	Give an interpretation or rendition of. <i>The evidence is difficult to <b>interpret</b>.</i>
<b>literally</b>	Used for emphasis while not being literally true. <i>The driver took it <b>literally</b> when asked to go straight over the roundabout.</i>
<b>metaphorical</b>	Expressing one thing in terms normally denoting another. <i>Many of our <b>metaphorical</b> expressions develop from our perceptions of the body.</i>
<b>oracular</b>	Holding or claiming the authority of an oracle. <i>The <b>oracular</b> sayings of Victorian poets.</i>
<b><u>outside</u></b>	Leading to or from the outside. <i>An <b>outside</b> chance.</i>
<b>parenthesis</b>	An interlude or interval. <i>In a challenging <b>parenthesis</b> Wordsworth comments on the evil effects of contemporary developments.</i>
<b><u>semantic</u></b>	Of or relating to meaning or the study of meaning.
<b>significance</b>	The quality of being worthy of attention; importance. <i>Do not underestimate the <b>significance</b> of nuclear power.</i>
<b>similarity</b>	A similar feature or aspect. <i>The <b>similarity</b> of symptoms makes them hard to diagnose.</i>
<b>synonymous</b>	Meaning the same or nearly the same. <i>His deeds had made his name <b>synonymous</b> with victory.</i>
<b>term</b>	Name formally or designate with a term. <i><b>Term</b> starts tomorrow.</i>
<b><u>text</u></b>	Send someone a text message. <i>The preacher chose a <b>text</b> from Psalms to introduce his sermon.</i>
