**obstructed** Shut off to passage or view or hindered from action.

A partially **obstructed** passageway.

occluded Closed off.

An **occluded** artery.

omit Leave undone or leave out.

He was **omit**ted from the second Test.

Full of difficulty or confusion or bewilderment.

**Perplexed** state of the world.

A covered shelter projecting in front of the entrance of a building.

Daniel and Lydia sat out on the **porch** for many hours.

Filled with bewilderment.

**Puzzled** that she left without saying goodbye.

(of a person's expression or behaviour) indicating mild or amused

quizzical puzzlement.

He had a **quizzical** expression.

respire Breathe easily again, as after exertion or anxiety.
