Associations of "Stuck out" (30 Words)

aboveground	On or above the surface of the ground. <i>Aboveground nuclear testing.</i>
absentee	One that is absent or not in residence. <i>An absentee from the match.</i>
absenteeism	The practice of regularly staying away from work or school without good reason. <i>High levels of absenteeism caused by low job motivation.</i>
away	An away match or win. <i>In front of them the land fell away to the river.</i>
barring	The act of excluding someone by a negative vote or veto.
blocked	Closed to traffic. <i>A large proportion of blocked sites are miscategorized.</i>
by	So as to pass a given point. <i>Put something by for her old age.</i>
closed	With shutters closed. <i>He sat quietly with closed eyes.</i>
decriminalize	Stop treating (something) as illegal or as a criminal offence. <i>A battle to decriminalize cannabis.</i>
defeatist	Demonstrating expectation or acceptance of failure. <i>We have a duty not to be so defeatist.</i>
except	Take exception to. <i>Five classes of advertisement are excepted from control.</i>
exclude	Prevent from entering; keep out. <i>Apply flux to exclude oxygen.</i>
exemption	The action of freeing or state of being free from an obligation or liability imposed on others. <i>Vehicles that may qualify for exemption from tax.</i>

<u>exhale</u>	Breathe out. <i>She sat back and exhaled deeply.</i>
<u>gone</u>	No longer present; departed. <i>You were gone a long time.</i>
<u>hall</u>	A large and imposing house. <i>The elevators were at the end of the hall.</i>
home	Made done or intended for use in the home. <i>What time did he get home last night.</i>
immobile	Not capable of movement or of being moved. <i>She sat immobile for a long time.</i>
leave	Leave behind unintentionally. <i>They leave the impression that they can be bullied.</i>
movement	A campaign undertaken by a political social or artistic movement. <i>The free movement of labour.</i>
obstructed	Shut off to passage or view or hindered from action. <i>A partially obstructed passageway.</i>
occluded	Closed off. <i>An occluded artery.</i>
<u>omit</u>	Leave undone or leave out. <i>He was omitted from the second Test.</i>
<u>perplexed</u>	Full of difficulty or confusion or bewilderment. <i>Perplexed state of the world.</i>
<u>porch</u>	A covered shelter projecting in front of the entrance of a building. <i>Daniel and Lydia sat out on the porch for many hours.</i>
<u>puzzled</u>	Filled with bewilderment. <i>Puzzled that she left without saying goodbye.</i>
quizzical	(of a person's expression or behaviour) indicating mild or amused puzzlement. <i>He had a quizzical expression.</i>
respire	Breathe easily again, as after exertion or anxiety. <i>Lichens respire at lower levels of temperature and moisture.</i>
roommate	An associate who shares a room with you.
<u>tent</u>	Cover with or as if with a tent. <i>The garden had been completely tented over for supper.</i>
