aboveground	On or above the surface of the ground. <i>Aboveground</i> nuclear testing.
absentee	One that is absent or not in residence. An absentee from the match.
<u>absenteeism</u>	The practice of regularly staying away from work or school without good reason. High levels of absenteeism caused by low job motivation.
<u>away</u>	An away match or win. In front of them the land fell away to the river.
<u>barring</u>	The act of excluding someone by a negative vote or veto.
blocked	Closed to traffic. A large proportion of blocked sites are miscategorized.
by	So as to pass a given point. Put something by for her old age.
<u>closed</u>	With shutters closed. <i>He sat quietly with closed eyes.</i>
decriminalize	Stop treating (something) as illegal or as a criminal offence. A battle to decriminalize cannabis.
defeatist	Demonstrating expectation or acceptance of failure. We have a duty not to be so defeatist .
except	Take exception to. Five classes of advertisement are except ed from control.
exclude	Prevent from entering; keep out. Apply flux to exclude oxygen.
exemption	The action of freeing or state of being free from an obligation or liability imposed on others. Vehicles that may qualify for exemption from tax.



<u>exhale</u>	Breathe out. She sat back and exhale d deeply.
<u>gone</u>	No longer present; departed. You were gone a long time.
<u>hall</u>	A large and imposing house. The elevators were at the end of the hall .
home	Made done or intended for use in the home. What time did he get home last night.
immobile	Not capable of movement or of being moved. She sat immobile for a long time.
leave	Leave behind unintentionally. They leave the impression that they can be bullied.
movement	A campaign undertaken by a political social or artistic movement. <i>The free movement of labour.</i>
obstructed	Shut off to passage or view or hindered from action. A partially obstructed passageway.
occluded	Closed off. An occluded artery.
<u>omit</u>	Leave undone or leave out. <i>He was omitted from the second Test.</i>
perplexed	Full of difficulty or confusion or bewilderment. Perplexed state of the world.
<u>porch</u>	A covered shelter projecting in front of the entrance of a building. <i>Daniel and Lydia sat out on the porch for many hours.</i>
<u>puzzled</u>	Filled with bewilderment. Puzzled that she left without saying goodbye.
quizzical	(of a person's expression or behaviour) indicating mild or amused puzzlement. <i>He had a quizzical expression.</i>
respire	Breathe easily again, as after exertion or anxiety. Lichens respire at lower levels of temperature and moisture.
roommate	An associate who shares a room with you.
<u>tent</u>	Cover with or as if with a tent. <i>The garden had been completely</i> tent ed over for supper.
