Associations of "Stuck" (30 Words)

aghast	Filled with horror or shock. <i>She winced aghast at his cruelty.</i>
amaze	Surprise (someone) greatly; fill with astonishment. <i>He has been amazed by the quality of the employees at the bank.</i>
bemuse	Puzzle, confuse, or bewilder (someone). <i>He was bemused by what was happening.</i>
bemused	Deeply absorbed in thought. <i>As distant and bemused as a professor listening to the prattling of his freshman class.</i>
bewilder	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>She was bewildered by his sudden change of mood.</i>
bewildered	Perplexed and confused; very puzzled. <i>Bewildered and confused.</i>
blocked	(of email or a website) prevented from being accessed or used. <i>The repaving results in many blocked streets.</i>
closed	With shutters closed. <i>He sat with his eyes closed.</i>
confused	Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity. <i>The sound of a sort of confused hammering and shouting.</i>
dismayed	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
dumbfound	Greatly astonish or amaze. <i>She was dumbfounded at the sight that met her eyes.</i>
expression	Expression without words. <i>Pardon the expression.</i>
feeling	The emotional side of someone's character; emotional responses or tendencies to respond. <i>He had a queasy feeling.</i>

gesticulate	Show, express or direct through movement. <i>They were shouting and gesticulating frantically at drivers who did not slow down.</i>
immobile	Securely fixed in place. <i>She sat immobile for a long time.</i>
loon	A person with confused ideas; incapable of serious thought. <i>If only she weren't such a lovesick loon.</i>
lost	Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity. <i>The lost platoon.</i>
motile	One whose prevailing mental imagery takes the form of inner feelings of action. <i>Males produce small motile gametes.</i>
motion	An optical illusion of motion produced by viewing a rapid succession of still pictures of a moving object. <i>A cushioned shoe that doesn't restrict motion.</i>
movement	A campaign undertaken by a political social or artistic movement. <i>He was a charter member of the movement.</i>
mystify	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>Lawyers who mystify the legal system so that laymen find it unintelligible.</i>
obstructed	Shut off to passage or view or hindered from action. <i>An obstructed view.</i>
occluded	Taken into and retained in another substance. <i>Large volumes of occluded hydrogen in palladium.</i>
perplexed	Full of difficulty or confusion or bewilderment. <i>She gave him a perplexed look.</i>
perplexing	Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity. <i>A perplexing problem.</i>
predicament	(in Aristotelian logic) each of the ten 'categories', often listed as: substance or being, quantity, quality, relation, place, time, posture, having or possession, action, and passion. <i>The club's financial predicament.</i>
puzzled	Filled with bewilderment. <i>Puzzled that she left without saying goodbye.</i>
questioning	A request for information. <i>The questioning mind of a child.</i>
quizzical	Playfully vexing (especially by ridicule)- Lawrence Durrell. <i>He had a quizzical expression.</i>

Taken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment.

Surprised that he remembered my name.
