## Associations of "Stuck" (30 Words)

<b>aghast</b>	Filled with horror or shock. <i>She winced <b>aghast</b> at his cruelty.</i>
<b>amaze</b>	Surprise (someone) greatly; fill with astonishment. <i>He has been <b>amazed</b> by the quality of the employees at the bank.</i>
<b>bemuse</b>	Puzzle, confuse, or bewilder (someone). <i>He was <b>bemused</b> by what was happening.</i>
<b>bemused</b>	Deeply absorbed in thought. <i>As distant and <b>bemused</b> as a professor listening to the prattling of his freshman class.</i>
<b>bewilder</b>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>She was <b>bewildered</b> by his sudden change of mood.</i>
<b>bewildered</b>	Perplexed and confused; very puzzled. <i><b>Bewildered</b> and confused.</i>
<b>blocked</b>	(of email or a website) prevented from being accessed or used. <i>The repaving results in many <b>blocked</b> streets.</i>
<b>closed</b>	With shutters closed. <i>He sat with his eyes <b>closed</b>.</i>
<b>confused</b>	Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity. <i>The sound of a sort of <b>confused</b> hammering and shouting.</i>
<b>dismayed</b>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<b>dumbfound</b>	Greatly astonish or amaze. <i>She was <b>dumbfounded</b> at the sight that met her eyes.</i>
<b>expression</b>	Expression without words. <i>Pardon the <b>expression</b>.</i>
<b>feeling</b>	The emotional side of someone’s character; emotional responses or tendencies to respond. <i>He had a queasy <b>feeling</b>.</i>

<b>gesticulate</b>	Show, express or direct through movement. <i>They were shouting and gesticulating frantically at drivers who did not slow down.</i>
<b>immobile</b>	Securely fixed in place. <i>She sat <b>immobile</b> for a long time.</i>
<b>loon</b>	A person with confused ideas; incapable of serious thought. <i>If only she weren't such a lovesick <b>loon</b>.</i>
<b>lost</b>	Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity. <i>The <b>lost</b> platoon.</i>
<b>motile</b>	One whose prevailing mental imagery takes the form of inner feelings of action. <i>Males produce small <b>motile</b> gametes.</i>
<b>motion</b>	An optical illusion of motion produced by viewing a rapid succession of still pictures of a moving object. <i>A cushioned shoe that doesn't restrict <b>motion</b>.</i>
<b>movement</b>	A campaign undertaken by a political social or artistic movement. <i>He was a charter member of the <b>movement</b>.</i>
<b>mystify</b>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>Lawyers who <b>mystify</b> the legal system so that laymen find it unintelligible.</i>
<b>obstructed</b>	Shut off to passage or view or hindered from action. <i>An <b>obstructed</b> view.</i>
<b>occluded</b>	Taken into and retained in another substance. <i>Large volumes of <b>occluded</b> hydrogen in palladium.</i>
<b>perplexed</b>	Full of difficulty or confusion or bewilderment. <i>She gave him a <b>perplexed</b> look.</i>
<b>perplexing</b>	Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity. <i>A <b>perplexing</b> problem.</i>
<b>predicament</b>	(in Aristotelian logic) each of the ten 'categories', often listed as: substance or being, quantity, quality, relation, place, time, posture, having or possession, action, and passion. <i>The club's financial <b>predicament</b>.</i>
<b>puzzled</b>	Filled with bewilderment. <i><b>Puzzled</b> that she left without saying goodbye.</i>
<b>questioning</b>	A request for information. <i>The <b>questioning</b> mind of a child.</i>
<b>quizzical</b>	Playfully vexing (especially by ridicule)- Lawrence Durrell. <i>He had a <b>quizzical</b> expression.</i>

Taken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment.  
**Surprised** *that he remembered my name.*
