| <a href="#"><u>elevate</u></a>  | Raise the axis of (a piece of artillery) to increase its range.<br><i>He was <b>elevated</b> to Secretary of State.</i>   |
| <b>elevator</b>                 | Lifting device consisting of a platform or cage that is raised and lowered mechanically in a vertical shaft in order to move people from one floor to another in a building.<br><i>In the <b>elevator</b> she pressed the button for the lobby.</i> |
| <b>escalator</b>                | A clause in a contract that provides for an increase or a decrease in wages or prices or benefits etc. depending on certain conditions (as a change in the cost of living index).   |
| <b>high</b>                     | Highly.<br><i>I m on a permanent <b>high</b> these days.</i>  |
| <a href="#"><u>hoist</u></a>    | Raise or haul up.<br><i><b>Hoist</b> a sail.</i>  |
| <b>ladder</b>                   | With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder.<br><i>Employees on their way up the career <b>ladder</b>.</i>   |

| <b>lift</b>        | An act of lifting.<br><i>This is a hackneyed adventure <b>lifted</b> straight from a vintage Lassie episode.</i>  |
| <b>mounting</b>    | The action of mounting something.<br><i>He pulled the curtain rail from its <b>mounting</b>.</i>  |
| <b>precipitate</b> | A substance precipitated from a solution.<br><i>I must apologize for my staff their actions were <b>precipitate</b>.</i>  |
| <b>promote</b>     | Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst.<br><i>They were <b>promoted</b> from the Third Division last season.</i>  |
| <b>raise</b>       | Multiply a number by itself a specified number of times 8 is 2 raised to the power 3.<br><i>With support for partner s bid suit you <b>raise</b> him to game in it.</i> |
| <b>rise</b>        | Rise up.<br><i><b>Rise</b> to a challenge.</i>  |
| <b>risen</b>       | (of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon.<br><i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>   |
| <b>rising</b>      | Advancing to maturity or high standing.<br><i>A <b>rising</b> market.</i>   |
| <b>soar</b>        | Fly by means of a hang glider.<br><i>When she heard his voice her spirits <b>soared</b>.</i>  |
| <b>soaring</b>     | Increasing rapidly above the usual level.<br><i>You may spy bighorn sheep and <b>soaring</b> eagles.</i>  |
| <b>stairs</b>      | A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.  |
| <b>stepladder</b>  | A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.  |
| <b>top</b>         | The top or extreme point of something usually a mountain or hill.<br><i>The balloon cleared the tree <b>tops</b>.</i>   |
| <b>uphill</b>      | Sloping upwards.<br><i>He gave mountain biking clinics on handling steep <b>uphills</b>.</i>  |
| <b>upstairs</b>    | On or to an upper floor of a building.<br><i>An <b>upstairs</b> bedroom.</i>  |
| <b>upward</b>      | Directed up.<br><i><b>Upwardly</b> mobile.</i>  |
| <b>vertically</b>  | (with reference to passage of diseases) from one generation to the next.<br><i><b>Vertically</b> integrated companies.</i>  |
| <b>zoom</b>        | Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out.<br><i>He jumped into his car and <b>zoomed</b> off.</i>   |
