### Definitions of "Stud" as a noun

- *Adult male horse kept for breeding.*
- *A fastener consisting of two buttons joined with a bar, used in formal wear to fasten a shirt front or to fasten a collar to a shirt.*
- *A man who is virile and sexually active.*
- *The height of a room as indicated by the length of a timber wall stud.*
- *A small metal piece set into the tyre of a motor vehicle to improve roadholding in slippery conditions.*
- *A small object projecting slightly from a road surface as a marker.*
- *A small projection fixed to the base of footwear, especially sports boots, to allow the wearer to grip the ground.*

- *A large-headed piece of metal that pierces and projects from a surface, especially for decoration.*
- *A rivet or crosspiece in each link of a chain cable.*
- *Ornament consisting of a circular rounded protuberance (as on a vault or shield or belt).*
- *An item of jewellery in the form of a piece of metal, precious stone, or other ornament attached to a pin or shaft that passes through a piercing in the body.*
- *Poker in which each player receives hole cards and the remainder are dealt face up; bets are placed after each card is dealt.*
- *An upright in house framing.*
- *An upright timber in the wall of a building to which laths and plasterboard are nailed.*

### **bulge**

Something that bulges out or is protuberant or projects from its surroundings.

*The advance created an eastward facing **bulge** in the line.*

<b>bump</b>	(on a person's birthday) a custom by which the person is lifted by the arms and legs and let down on to the ground, once for each year of their age. <i>There was a <b>bump</b> in the number of outbound flights.</i>
<b>carbuncle</b>	An infection larger than a boil and with several openings for discharge of pus.
<b>excrescence</b>	A distinct outgrowth on a body or plant, resulting from disease or abnormality. <i>The males often have a strange <b>excrescence</b> on the tip of the snout.</i>
<b>fastener</b>	A person who fastens or makes fast. <i>The <b>fasteners</b> that attach the panel to the wall had corroded.</i>
<b>gnarl</b>	Something twisted and tight and swollen. <i>The old man s fists were two great <b>gnarls</b>.</i>
<b>growth</b>	(biology) the process of an individual organism growing organically; a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>The <b>growth</b> of the city affects the local climate.</i>
<b>he-man</b>	A man who is virile and sexually active.
<b>knot</b>	A particular method of making a knot. <i>His stomach was in <b>knots</b>.</i>
<b>link</b>	The means of connection between things linked in series. <i>They set up a satellite <b>link</b> with Tokyo.</i>
<b>lump</b>	A large piece of something without definite shape. <i><b>Lump</b> labour.</i>
<b>macho-man</b>	A man who is virile and sexually active.
<b>node</b>	A lymph node or other structure consisting of a small mass of differentiated tissue. <i>The company s internal worldwide area network now has some 22 000 <b>nodes</b>.</i>
<b>nodule</b>	A small rounded lump of matter distinct from its surroundings, e.g. of flint in chalk, carbon in cast iron, or a mineral on the seabed. <i>Flint <b>nodules</b>.</i>
<b>outgrowth</b>	Something that grows out of something else. <i>With further <b>outgrowth</b> the radius and ulna develop.</i>
<b>projection</b>	The projection of an image from a film onto a screen. <i>The legal profession s <b>projection</b> of an image of altruism.</i>
<b>protrusion</b>	Something that bulges out or is protuberant or projects from its surroundings. <i>A <b>protrusion</b> of rock jutted from the mountainside.</i>



<b>protuberance</b>	The fact or state of protruding. <i>The large size and <b>protuberance</b> of the incisors.</i>
<b>rivet</b>	A device similar to a rivet for holding seams of clothing together. <i>A device for punching <b>rivet</b> holes.</i>
<b>scantling</b>	A specimen, sample, or small amount of something.
<b>stud poker</b>	Adult male horse kept for breeding.
<b>studhorse</b>	Adult male horse kept for breeding.
<b>swelling</b>	An abnormal protuberance or localized enlargement. <i>The lobes are prominent <b>swellings</b> on the base of the brain.</i>
<b>toggle</b>	A key or command that is operated the same way but with opposite effect on successive occasions.
<b>tumour</b>	A swelling of any kind.

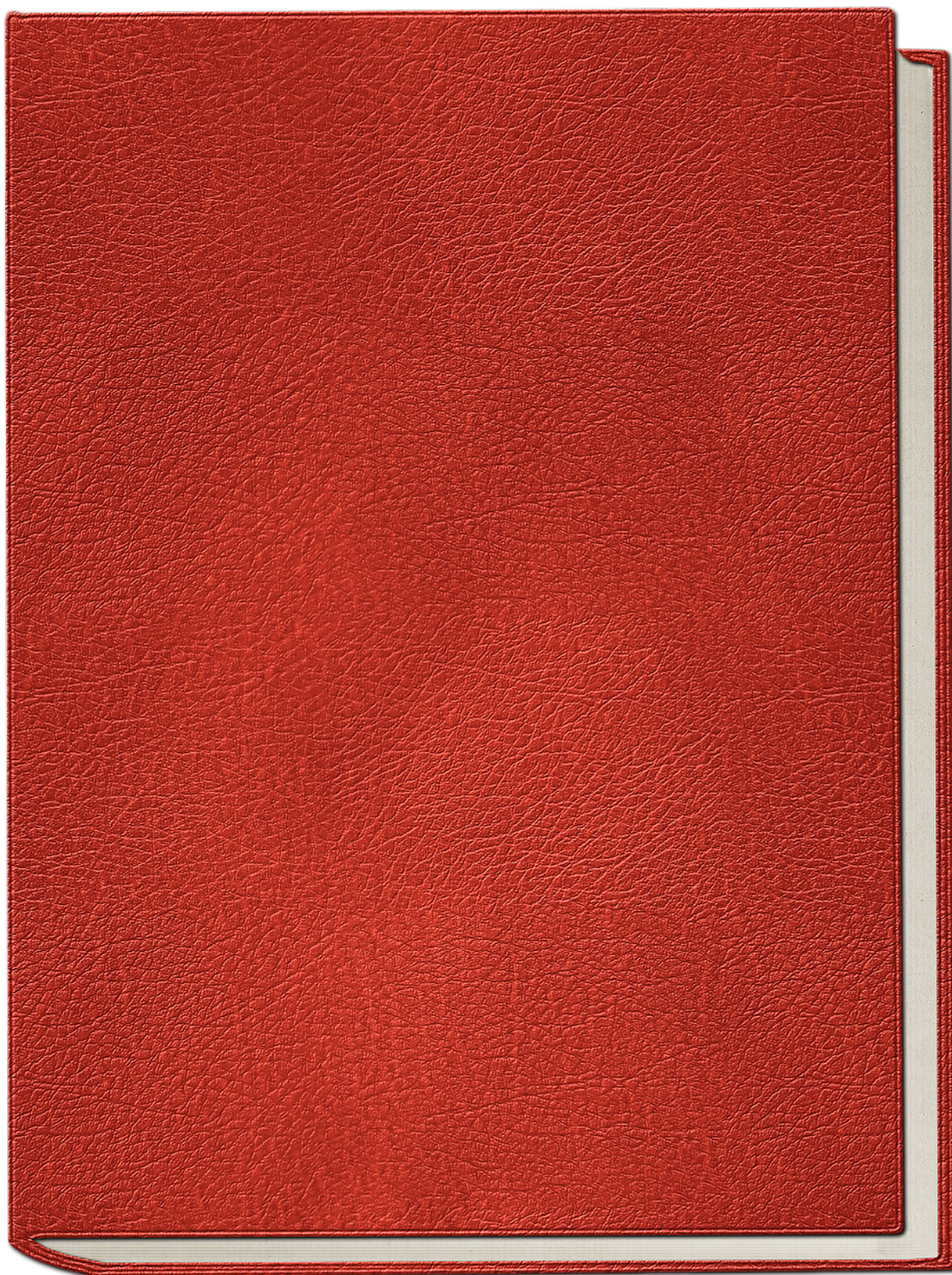

<u><b>diamond</b></u>	A card of the suit of diamonds. <i>She led a losing <b>diamond</b>.</i>
<b>dot</b>	Mark with a dot. <i>Wet spots of rain began to <b>dot</b> his shirt.</i>
<b>earring</b>	Jewelry to ornament the ear; usually clipped to the earlobe or fastened through a hole in the lobe.
<b>escutcheon</b>	A shield or emblem bearing a coat of arms.
<u><b>gem</b></u>	Used in names of some brilliantly coloured hummingbirds e g mountain gem. <i>Tiny drops of sweat <b>gemmed</b> his forehead.</i>
<u><b>gold</b></u>	Coins made of gold. <i>The <b>gold</b> dome of the Capitol.</i>
<u><b>golden</b></u>	Suggestive of gold. <i>A <b>golden</b> voice.</i>
<u><b>jewelry</b></u>	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems).

<b>metallic</b>	A paint fabric or colour with a metallic sheen. <i>A beautiful <b>metallic</b> green sports car.</i>
<b>miner</b>	A person who works in a mine. <i>The <b>miners</b> were freed after spending four days trapped underground.</i>
<b>mineshaft</b>	A deep narrow vertical hole, or sometimes a horizontal tunnel, that gives access to a mine. <i>One member of this party almost vanished down a hidden disused <b>mineshaft</b>.</i>
<b>necklace</b>	In South Africa kill someone with a tyre necklace. <i>A diamond <b>necklace</b>.</i>
<b>pearl</b>	An artificial imitation of a pearl. <i>Every child is a precious <b>pearl</b> and deserves to be treated as such.</i>
<b>platinum</b>	Greyish white or silvery like platinum. <i>A <b>platinum</b> wig.</i>
<b>precious</b>	Obviously contrived to charm. <i><b>Precious</b> memories.</i>
<b>ring</b>	Attach a ring to the foot of in order to identify. <i>He had a silver <b>ring</b> on one finger.</i>
<b>rivet</b>	Join or fasten plates of metal with a rivet or rivets. <i>The linings are bonded not <b>riveted</b> to the brake shoes for longer wear.</i>
<a href="#"><u>silver</u></a>	Silver dishes containers or cutlery. <i><b>Silvery</b> hair.</i>
