Stud as a Noun

Definitions of "Stud" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “stud” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Adult male horse kept for breeding.*
- *A fastener consisting of two buttons joined with a bar, used in formal wear to fasten a shirt front or to fasten a collar to a shirt.*
- *A man who is virile and sexually active.*
- *The height of a room as indicated by the length of a timber wall stud.*
- *A small metal piece set into the tyre of a motor vehicle to improve roadholding in slippery conditions.*
- *A small object projecting slightly from a road surface as a marker.*
- *A small projection fixed to the base of footwear, especially sports boots, to allow the wearer to grip the ground.*

- A large-headed piece of metal that pierces and projects from a surface, especially for decoration.
- A rivet or crosspiece in each link of a chain cable.
- Ornament consisting of a circular rounded protuberance (as on a vault or shield or belt).
- An item of jewellery in the form of a piece of metal, precious stone, or other ornament attached to a pin or shaft that passes through a piercing in the body.
- Poker in which each player receives hole cards and the remainder are dealt face up; bets are placed after each card is dealt.
- An upright in house framing.
- An upright timber in the wall of a building to which laths and plasterboard are nailed.

Something that bulges out or is protuberant or projects from its surroundings.

The advance created an eastward facing **bulge** in the line.

bump	(on a person's birthday) a custom by which the person is lifted by the arms and legs and let down on to the ground, once for each year of their age. <i>There was a bump in the number of outbound flights.</i>
carbuncle	An infection larger than a boil and with several openings for discharge of pus.
excrescence	A distinct outgrowth on a body or plant, resulting from disease or abnormality. <i>The males often have a strange excrescence on the tip of the snout.</i>
fastener	A person who fastens or makes fast. <i>The fasteners that attach the panel to the wall had corroded.</i>
gnarl	Something twisted and tight and swollen. <i>The old man s fists were two great gnarls.</i>
growth	(biology) the process of an individual organism growing organically; a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>The growth of the city affects the local climate.</i>
he-man	A man who is virile and sexually active.
knot	A particular method of making a knot. <i>His stomach was in knots.</i>
link	The means of connection between things linked in series. <i>They set up a satellite link with Tokyo.</i>
lump	A large piece of something without definite shape. <i>Lump labour.</i>
macho-man	A man who is virile and sexually active.
node	A lymph node or other structure consisting of a small mass of differentiated tissue. <i>The company s internal worldwide area network now has some 22 000 nodes.</i>
nodule	A small rounded lump of matter distinct from its surroundings, e.g. of flint in chalk, carbon in cast iron, or a mineral on the seabed. <i>Flint nodules.</i>
outgrowth	Something that grows out of something else. <i>With further outgrowth the radius and ulna develop.</i>
projection	The projection of an image from a film onto a screen. <i>The legal profession s projection of an image of altruism.</i>
protrusion	Something that bulges out or is protuberant or projects from its surroundings. <i>A protrusion of rock jutted from the mountainside.</i>

protuberance	The fact or state of protruding. <i>The large size and protuberance of the incisors.</i>
rivet	A device similar to a rivet for holding seams of clothing together. <i>A device for punching rivet holes.</i>
scantling	A specimen, sample, or small amount of something.
stud poker	Adult male horse kept for breeding.
studhorse	Adult male horse kept for breeding.
swelling	An abnormal protuberance or localized enlargement. <i>The lobes are prominent swellings on the base of the brain.</i>
toggle	A key or command that is operated the same way but with opposite effect on successive occasions.
tumour	A swelling of any kind.

- Provide with or construct with studs.



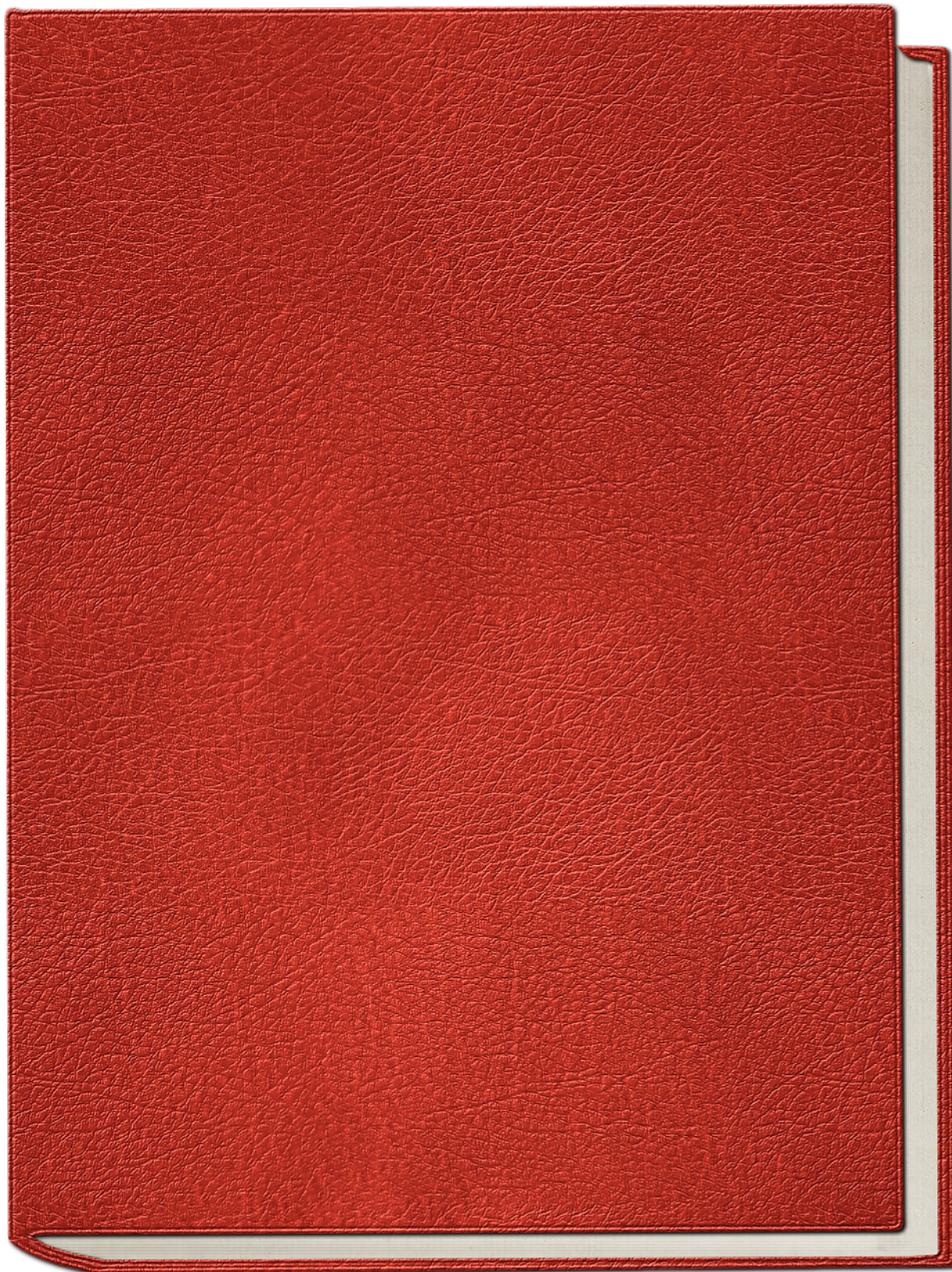
Synonyms of "Stud" as a verb (4 Words)

constellate	Come together as in a cluster or flock. <i>The towns and valleys where people constellate.</i>
dot	Make a dot or dots. <i>You need to dot the i.</i>
peppered	Add pepper to.
sprinkled	Rain gently.

- *A dagger studded with precious diamonds.*
- *Stud the wall.*

amethyst	A precious stone consisting of a violet or purple variety of quartz. <i>Amethyst earrings.</i>
andiron	A metal stand, typically one of a pair, for supporting wood burning in a fireplace. <i>The andirons were too hot to touch.</i>
bead	A beaded molding for edging or decorating furniture. <i>Long strings of beads.</i>
beaded	Covered with beads of liquid. <i>A beaded evening bag.</i>
betrothal	Formal engagement to be married; engagement.
bracelet	A band of cloth or leather or metal links attached to a wristwatch and wrapped around the wrist.
button	Any of various plant parts that resemble buttons. <i>Just search for the app you want and click the buy or install button.</i>
carat	A measure of the purity of gold pure gold being 24 carats. <i>22 carat gold.</i>
<u>chain</u>	A measure of length equivalent to a chain 66 ft. <i>Our offer was accepted this morning and there s no chain.</i>
circlet	A small circle.
<u>diamond</u>	A card of the suit of diamonds. <i>She led a losing diamond.</i>
dot	Mark with a dot. <i>Wet spots of rain began to dot his shirt.</i>
earring	Jewelry to ornament the ear; usually clipped to the earlobe or fastened through a hole in the lobe.
escutcheon	A shield or emblem bearing a coat of arms.
<u>gem</u>	Used in names of some brilliantly coloured hummingbirds e g mountain gem. <i>Tiny drops of sweat gemmed his forehead.</i>
<u>gold</u>	Coins made of gold. <i>The gold dome of the Capitol.</i>
<u>golden</u>	Suggestive of gold. <i>A golden voice.</i>
<u>jewelry</u>	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems).

metallic	A paint fabric or colour with a metallic sheen. <i>A beautiful metallic green sports car.</i>
miner	A person who works in a mine. <i>The miners were freed after spending four days trapped underground.</i>
mineshaft	A deep narrow vertical hole, or sometimes a horizontal tunnel, that gives access to a mine. <i>One member of this party almost vanished down a hidden disused mineshaft.</i>
necklace	In South Africa kill someone with a tyre necklace. <i>A diamond necklace.</i>
pearl	An artificial imitation of a pearl. <i>Every child is a precious pearl and deserves to be treated as such.</i>
platinum	Greyish white or silvery like platinum. <i>A platinum wig.</i>
precious	Obviously contrived to charm. <i>Precious memories.</i>
ring	Attach a ring to the foot of in order to identify. <i>He had a silver ring on one finger.</i>
rivet	Join or fasten plates of metal with a rivet or rivets. <i>The linings are bonded not riveted to the brake shoes for longer wear.</i>
<u>silver</u>	Silver dishes containers or cutlery. <i>Silvery hair.</i>
turquoise	A semi-precious stone, typically opaque and of a greenish-blue or sky-blue colour, consisting of a hydrated phosphate of copper and aluminium. <i>The turquoise waters of the bay.</i>
