Remained **conscious** during the operation.

**considered** Having been thought about carefully.  
A **considered** opinion.

**deliberate** Careful and unhurried.  
A **deliberate** attempt to provoke a response.

**designed** Done or made or performed with purpose and intent.  
Style is more than the deliberate and **designed** creation.

<b>intentional</b>	Done or made or performed with purpose and intent- Havelock Ellis. <b>Intentional</b> wrongdoing and harm.
<b>knowing</b>	Showing or suggesting that one has knowledge or awareness that is secret or known to only a few people. A <b>knowing</b> act of fraud.
<b>mannered</b>	Having unnatural mannerisms. Bad <b>mannered</b> .
<b>measured</b>	(of speech or writing) carefully considered and restrained. With <b>measured</b> irony.
<b>purposeful</b>	Serving as or indicating the existence of a purpose or goal. <b>Purposeful</b> activities.
<b>studious</b>	Spending a lot of time studying or reading. He made a <b>studious</b> inspection of the buffet.
<b>thoughtful</b>	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. A <b>thoughtful</b> paper.
<b>volitional</b>	With deliberate intention. Acceptance is a <b>volitional</b> act.
