## Studio as a Noun

### Definitions of "Studio" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “studio” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Workplace for the teaching or practice of an art.*
- *Workplace consisting of a room or building where movies or television shows or radio programs are produced and recorded.*
- *A room where an artist, photographer, sculptor, etc. works.*
- *An apartment with a living space and a bathroom and a small kitchen.*
- *A film or television production company.*
- *A room from which television programmes are broadcast, or in which they are recorded.*
- *A studio flat.*
- *A place where performers, especially dancers, practise and exercise.*
- *A place where cinema films are made or produced.*
- *A place where musical or sound recordings are made.*



### Synonyms of "Studio" as a noun (4 Words)

**atelier**

A studio especially for an artist or designer.

**studio apartment** An apartment with a living space and a bathroom and a small kitchen.

**workroom**

A room for working in, especially one equipped for a particular kind of work.

**workshop**

A brief intensive course for a small group; emphasizes problem solving.  
*A writers **workshop** was held on 25 27 July.*

- *She ran a dance studio.*
- *A big-budget contract with a major studio.*
- *You don't need a studio to make a passport photograph.*
- *All apartments and studios have private facilities.*
- *Mostly the painting is done in the studio, working from drawings.*
- *The broadcasts will be transmitted from the Middlesbrough studios.*
- *The Department of Music has a professional recording studio.*
- *The big names are being snapped up by major studios in the film capital.*
- *The music department provided studios for their students.*

- academy** A learned establishment for the advancement of knowledge.  
*A police **academy**.*
- audio** The audible part of a transmitted signal.  
*They always raise the **audio** for commercials.*
- barograph** A recording barometer; automatically records on paper the variations in atmospheric pressure.
- camcorder** A portable combined video camera and video recorder.
- camera** Equipment for taking photographs (usually consisting of a lightproof box with a lens at one end and light-sensitive film at the other).  
*She faced the **cameras**.*
- cassette** A sealed plastic unit containing a length of audio tape, videotape, film, etc. wound on a pair of spools, for insertion into a recorder, playback device, or other machine.

<b>click</b>	Produce a click. <i>Martha <b>clicked</b> her tongue.</i>
<b>commentary</b>	An expression of opinions or offering of explanations about an event or situation. <i>A live <b>commentary</b> on radio.</i>
<b>dictation</b>	An authoritative direction or instruction to do something. <i>He signed and mailed his <b>dictation</b> without bothering to read it.</i>
<b>dubbing</b>	A new soundtrack that is added to a film.
<b>educator</b>	Someone who educates young people. <i>The perspective of a professional <b>educator</b>.</i>
<b>enrol</b>	Officially register as a member of an institution or a student on a course. <i>Our Seamen and their numbers were carefully <b>enrolled</b>.</i>
<b>enrollment</b>	The act of enrolling.
<b>gramophone</b>	An antique record player; the sound of the vibrating needle is amplified acoustically.
<b>musician</b>	Artist who composes or conducts music as a profession. <i>Aspiring rock and pop <b>musicians</b>.</i>
<b>musicologist</b>	A student of musicology.
<b>performer</b>	A person who entertains an audience. <i>A circus <b>performer</b>.</i>
<b>phonograph</b>	A record player.
<b>playback</b>	Electronic equipment comprising the part of a tape recorder that reproduces the recorded material. <i>He was allowed to hear the <b>playback</b> of his testimony.</i>
<b>recorder</b>	A person who keeps records. <i>I was talking away into my <b>recorder</b>.</i>
<b>recording</b>	The action or process of recording sound or a performance for subsequent reproduction or broadcast. <i>She watched the <b>recording</b> from a sound proof booth.</i>
<b>school</b>	The pupils and staff of a school. <i><b>School</b> started at 7 a m.</i>
<b>stenographer</b>	Someone skilled in the transcription of speech (especially dictation). <i>A court <b>stenographer</b>.</i>
<b>subliminal</b>	Below the threshold of conscious perception.
<b>subtitle</b>	Provide a published work or article with a subtitle. <i>The novel was aptly <b>subtitled</b>.</i>

- tape** Seal or mark off an area or thing with tape.  
*They **taped** off an area round the scene of the explosion.*
- taxidermy** The art of mounting the skins of animals so that they have lifelike appearance.
- transcription** Something written, especially copied from one medium to another, as a typewritten version of dictation.  
*Our usual **transcription** is given in brackets.*
- tv** Broadcasting visual images of stationary or moving objects.  
*The British call a **tv** set a telly.*
- video** A recording of moving visual images made digitally or on videotape.  
*He **videoed** our wedding.*
