<b>conscious</b>	Having knowledge of something. <i>Although I was in pain I was <b>conscious</b>.</i>
<b>contrived</b>	Created or arranged in a way that seems artificial and unrealistic. <i>A novel with a <b>contrived</b> ending.</i>
<b>deliberate</b>	Done consciously and intentionally. <i>With all <b>deliberate</b> speed.</i>
<b>designed</b>	Done or made or performed with purpose and intent- Havelock Ellis. <i>Well <b>designed</b> houses.</i>
<b>diligent</b>	Quietly and steadily persevering especially in detail or exactness. <i>After <b>diligent</b> searching he found a parcel.</i>
<b>donnish</b>	Marked by a narrow focus on or display of learning especially its trivial aspects.
<b>earnest</b>	Sincerely earnest. <i>Two girls were in <b>earnest</b> conversation.</i>
<b>erudite</b>	Having or showing profound knowledge. <i>An <b>erudite</b> professor.</i>
<b>heedful</b>	Aware of and attentive to. <i>He is <b>heedful</b> of his own intuitions.</i>

<b><u>industrious</u></b>	Diligent and hard-working. An <b>industrious</b> people striving to make their country prosperous.
<b><u>intellectual</u></b>	Appealing to or requiring use of the intellect. Children need <b>intellectual</b> stimulation.
<b><u>intentional</u></b>	Characterized by conscious design or purpose. <b>Intentional</b> damage.
<b>knowing</b>	Showing or suggesting that one has knowledge or awareness that is secret or known to only a few people. A <b>knowing</b> act of fraud.
<b>learned</b>	Showing, requiring, or characterized by learning; scholarly. An article in a <b>learned</b> journal.
<b>mannered</b>	Behaving in a specified way. Bad <b>mannered</b> .
<b>measured</b>	The rhythmic arrangement of syllables. She set off with <b>measured</b> tread.
<b><u>meticulous</u></b>	Showing great attention to detail; very careful and precise. The designs are hand glazed with <b>meticulous</b> care.
<b><u>painstaking</u></b>	Done with or employing great care and thoroughness. He is a gentle <b>painstaking</b> man.
<b>punctilious</b>	Marked by precise accordance with details. He was <b>punctilious</b> in providing every amenity for his guests.
<b>purposeful</b>	Having meaning through having an aim. Led a happy <b>purposeful</b> life.
<b><u>scholarly</u></b>	Involving or relating to serious academic study. <b>Scholarly</b> pursuits.
<b>sedulous</b>	Marked by care and persistent effort. <b>Sedulous</b> pursuit of legal and moral principles.
<b>serious</b>	Requiring effort or concentration; complex and not easy to answer or solve. He bridges the gap between <b>serious</b> and popular music.
<b><u>studied</u></b>	Produced or marked by conscious design or premeditation- V.L.Parrington. A <b>studied</b> smile.

<b>wilful</b>	Done by design. A spoiled <b>wilful</b> child.
<b>zealous</b>	Marked by active interest and enthusiasm. The council was extremely <b>zealous</b> in the application of the regulations.

<b>monograph</b>	Write a monograph on treat in a monograph. <i>They are publishing a series of <b>monographs</b> on music in late medieval and Renaissance cities.</i>
<b>moralist</b>	A person given to moralizing.
<b>morality</b>	Principles concerning the distinction between right and wrong or good and bad behaviour. <i>A bourgeois <b>morality</b>.</i>
<b>painstaking</b>	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. <i>He is a gentle <b>painstaking</b> man.</i>
<b>plodding</b>	Slow-moving and unexciting. <i>A <b>plodding</b> comedy drama.</i>

<b>steady</b>	Make steady. <i>A <b>steady</b> drinker.</i>
<b>successfully</b>	In a way that accomplishes a desired aim or result. <i>She has <b>successfully</b> completed her mission.</i>
