deliberate	Done consciously and intentionally. <i>With all deliberate speed.</i>
designed	Done or made or performed with purpose and intent- Havelock Ellis. <i>Well designed houses.</i>
diligent	Quietly and steadily persevering especially in detail or exactness. <i>After diligent searching he found a parcel.</i>
donnish	Marked by a narrow focus on or display of learning especially its trivial aspects.
earnest	Sincerely earnest. <i>Two girls were in earnest conversation.</i>
erudite	Having or showing profound knowledge. <i>An erudite professor.</i>
heedful	Aware of and attentive to. <i>He is heedful of his own intuitions.</i>

<u>industrious</u>	Diligent and hard-working. <i>An industrious people striving to make their country prosperous.</i>
<u>intellectual</u>	Appealing to or requiring use of the intellect. <i>Children need intellectual stimulation.</i>
<u>intentional</u>	Characterized by conscious design or purpose. <i>Intentional damage.</i>
knowing	Showing or suggesting that one has knowledge or awareness that is secret or known to only a few people. <i>A knowing act of fraud.</i>
learned	Showing, requiring, or characterized by learning; scholarly. <i>An article in a learned journal.</i>
mannered	Behaving in a specified way. <i>Bad mannered.</i>
measured	The rhythmic arrangement of syllables. <i>She set off with measured tread.</i>
<u>meticulous</u>	Showing great attention to detail; very careful and precise. <i>The designs are hand glazed with meticulous care.</i>
<u>painstaking</u>	Done with or employing great care and thoroughness. <i>He is a gentle painstaking man.</i>
punctilious	Marked by precise accordance with details. <i>He was punctilious in providing every amenity for his guests.</i>
purposeful	Having meaning through having an aim. <i>Led a happy purposeful life.</i>
<u>scholarly</u>	Involving or relating to serious academic study. <i>Scholarly pursuits.</i>
sedulous	Marked by care and persistent effort. <i>Sedulous pursuit of legal and moral principles.</i>
serious	Requiring effort or concentration; complex and not easy to answer or solve. <i>He bridges the gap between serious and popular music.</i>
<u>studied</u>	Produced or marked by conscious design or premeditation- V.L.Parrington. <i>A studied smile.</i>
<u>thorough</u>	Absolute (used to emphasize the degree of something, typically something unwelcome or unpleasant). <i>A thorough nuisance.</i>
thoughtful	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>Her work is thoughtful and provocative.</i>

- zealous** Marked by active interest and enthusiasm.

<u>meticulous</u>	Marked by precise accordance with details. <i>He had always been so meticulous about his appearance.</i>
monograph	Write a monograph on treat in a monograph. <i>They are publishing a series of monographs on music in late medieval and Renaissance cities.</i>
moralist	A person given to moralizing.
morality	Principles concerning the distinction between right and wrong or good and bad behaviour. <i>A bourgeois morality.</i>
<u>painstaking</u>	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. <i>He is a gentle painstaking man.</i>
plodding	Slow-moving and unexciting. <i>A plodding comedy drama.</i>
<u>scholarly</u>	Having or showing knowledge, learning, or devotion to academic pursuits. <i>A scholarly account of the period.</i>

scrupulous	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. <i>Less scrupulous producers sent bundles that were deceptive in appearance.</i>
sedulous	(of a person or action) showing dedication and diligence. <i>He watched himself with the most sedulous care.</i>
steady	Make steady. <i>A steady drinker.</i>
successfully	In a way that accomplishes a desired aim or result. <i>She has successfully completed her mission.</i>
tireless	Having or showing great effort or energy. <i>A tireless campaigner.</i>
worker	A person who achieves a specified thing. <i>Workers of the world unite.</i>
