astonied Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.

Greatly surprised or impressed; amazed. **astonished**

Astounded viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.

Stunned or confused and slow to react (as from blows or drunkenness or

The book should be **out** before the end of the month.




stupefied As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. *Lay semiconscious stunned or stupefied by the blow.*



Usage Examples of "Stunned" as an adjective

- Stood in stunned silence.
- A silent, stunned crowd.
- She stared at him in stunned disbelief.
- Lay semiconscious, stunned (or stupefied) by the blow.
- Stunned scientists found not one but at least three viruses.

He **surprise**d an interesting scene.

surprised Feeling or showing surprise.

Surprised that he remembered my name.

unnerve Disturb the composure of.

The journey over the bridge had **unnerve**d me.
