## Stunned as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Stunned" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “stunned” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *In a state of mental numbness especially as resulting from shock.*
- *Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.*
- *Knocked unconscious by a heavy blow.*
- *So shocked that one is temporarily unable to react; astonished.*



## Synonyms of "Stunned" as an adjective (10 Words)

- amazed** Greatly surprised; astonished.  
*She shook her head in **amazed** disbelief.*
- astonied** Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.
- astonished** Greatly surprised or impressed; amazed.  
*He was **astonished** at the change in him.*
- astounded** Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.  
***Astounded** viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.*
- dazed** Stunned or confused and slow to react (as from blows or drunkenness or exhaustion).  
*A **dazed** expression.*
- kayoed** Knocked unconscious by a heavy blow.
- ko'd** Knocked unconscious by a heavy blow.
- out** Being out or having grown cold.  
*The book should be **out** before the end of the month.*

**stupefied** As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise.  
*Lay semiconscious stunned or **stupefied** by the blow.*



### Usage Examples of "Stunned" as an adjective

- *Stood in stunned silence.*
- *A silent, stunned crowd.*
- *She stared at him in stunned disbelief.*
- *Lay semiconscious, stunned (or stupefied) by the blow.*
- *Stunned scientists found not one but at least three viruses.*

- amaze** Surprise (someone) greatly; fill with astonishment.  
*Your ability to speak six languages **amazes** me.*
- astonish** Affect with wonder.  
*It **astonished** her that he was so anxious.*
- astound** Affect with wonder.  
*Her bluntness **astounded** him.*
- astounding** Surprisingly impressive or notable.  
*The summit offers **astounding** views.*
- bewilder** Be a mystery or bewildering to.  
*His reaction had **bewildered** her.*
- blank** A blank gap or missing part.  
*When I called her name she gave me a **blank** look as though she didn't know me.*
- coma** A state of extreme lethargy or sleepiness.  
*She went into a **coma**.*

<b>daunt</b>	Make (someone) feel intimidated or apprehensive. <i>Some people are <b>daunted</b> by technology.</i>
<b>daze</b>	The feeling of distress and disbelief that you have when something bad happens accidentally. <i>He was walking around in a <b>daze</b>.</i>
<b>disconcert</b>	Disturb the composure of; unsettle. <i>The abrupt change of subject <b>disconcerted</b> her.</i>
<b>distract</b>	Having the attention diverted especially because of anxiety. <i>He seemed oddly <b>distract</b>.</i>
<b>dumbfound</b>	Greatly astonish or amaze. <i>I was <b>dumbfound</b> by the low prices there.</i>
<b>embarrass</b>	Cause to be embarrassed cause to feel self conscious. <i>He would be <b>embarrassed</b> by estate duty.</i>
<b>faze</b>	Disturb or disconcert (someone). <i>She was not <b>fazed</b> by his show of anger.</i>
<b>impact</b>	A forceful consequence; a strong effect. <i>An asteroid <b>impacted</b> the earth some 60 million years ago.</i>
<b>intimidate</b>	Make timid or fearful. <i>Her boss <b>intimidates</b> her.</i>
<b>limbo</b>	A state of neglect or oblivion. <i>These prisoners are in <b>limbo</b> no one is responsible for their welfare.</i>
<b>mystify</b>	Make mysterious. <i>Lawyers who <b>mystify</b> the legal system so that laymen find it unintelligible.</i>
<b>paralyze</b>	Cause to be paralyzed and immobile. <i>Fear <b>paralyzed</b> her.</i>
<b>perplex</b>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>They were <b>perplexing</b> a subject plain in itself.</i>
<b>shock</b>	Affect with physiological shock or with an electric shock. <i>Electricians get accustomed to occasional <b>shocks</b>.</i>
<b>skittish</b>	Unpredictably excitable (especially of horses). <i>A <b>skittish</b> chestnut mare.</i>
<b>smitten</b>	Marked by foolish or unreasoning fondness. <i>Conscience <b>smitten</b>.</i>
<b>staggering</b>	Deeply shocking; astonishing. <i>Suffered a <b>staggering</b> defeat.</i>
<b>startle</b>	Cause to feel sudden shock or alarm. <i>The loud noise <b>startled</b> him awake.</i>

**stupefy** Make (someone) unable to think or feel properly.  
*The offence of administering drugs to a woman with intent to **stupefy** her.*

**stupor** A state of near-unconsciousness or insensibility.  
*Someone stole his wallet while he was in a drunken **stupor**.*

**surprise** Cause to be surprised.  
*He **surprised** an interesting scene.*

**surprised** Feeling or showing surprise.  
***Surprised** that he remembered my name.*

**unnerve** Disturb the composure of.  
*The journey over the bridge had **unnerved** me.*
