<b>absurdity</b>	The quality or state of being ridiculous or wildly unreasonable. <i>Duncan laughed at the <b>absurdity</b> of the situation.</i>
<b>asininity</b>	The quality of being asinine; stupidity combined with stubbornness.
<b>betise</b>	A stupid mistake.
<b>denseness</b>	The spatial property of being crowded together.
<b>dullness</b>	Lack of interest or excitement. <i><b>Dullness</b> of comprehension.</i>
<b>fatuity</b>	A ludicrous folly.
<b>fatuousness</b>	A ludicrous folly.
<b>folly</b>	A theatrical revue with glamorous female performers. <i>Trying to drive through a blizzard is the height of <b>folly</b>.</i>
<b>foolishness</b>	Lack of good sense or judgement; stupidity. <i>Adjusting to an insane society is total <b>foolishness</b>.</i>

<b>fruitlessness</b>	A lack of creative imagination.
<b>futility</b>	Uselessness as a consequence of having no practical result. <i>The horror and <b>futility</b> of war.</i>
<b>idiocy</b>	Extreme mental retardation. <i>The <b>idiocy</b> of decimating yew forests.</i>
<b>ignorance</b>	Lack of knowledge or information. <i>He acted in <b>ignorance</b> of basic procedures.</i>
<b>imbecility</b>	Retardation more severe than a moron but not as severe as an idiot.
<b>inanity</b>	A nonsensical remark or action. <i>He commented on the breathtaking <b>inanity</b> of the board's decision.</i>
<b>ineptitude</b>	Having no qualities that would render it valuable or useful. <i>The officials displayed remarkable <b>ineptitude</b>.</i>
<b>injudiciousness</b>	The trait of being injudicious.
<b>insanity</b>	Relatively permanent disorder of the mind. <i>It might be pure <b>insanity</b> to take this loan.</i>
<b>irrationality</b>	The quality of being illogical or unreasonable. <i>The <b>irrationality</b> of square roots.</i>
<b>irresponsibility</b>	A form of untrustworthiness; the trait of lacking a sense of responsibility and not feeling accountable for your actions. <i>The economic ills are a consequence of greed and <b>irresponsibility</b>.</i>
<b>lack of intelligence</b>	The state of needing something that is absent or unavailable.
<b>lunacy</b>	The state of being a lunatic; insanity (not in technical use). <i>It has been suggested that originality demands a degree of <b>lunacy</b>.</i>
<b>madness</b>	The state of having a serious mental illness. <i>In his <b>madness</b> he destroyed the work of years.</i>
<b>meaninglessness</b>	A message that seems to convey no meaning. <i>He resented the <b>meaninglessness</b> of the tasks they assigned him.</i>
<b>mindlessness</b>	The trait of acting rashly and without prudence.
<b>pointlessness</b>	Total lack of meaning or ideas.
<b>ridiculousness</b>	A message whose content is at variance with reason. <i>I recognize the sheer <b>ridiculousness</b> of being afraid of something the size of my thumbnail.</i>
<b>senselessness</b>	Total lack of meaning or ideas.
<b>silliness</b>	Lack of common sense or judgement; foolishness. <i>She had to laugh at her own <b>silliness</b>.</i>
<b>slow-wittedness</b>	The quality of being mentally slow and limited.

**slowness**

The quality of taking a long time.  
*He was mocked for his **slowness** in class.*

**vacancy**

An empty area or space.  
***Vacancy** vanity and inane deception.*

<b>airhead</b>	A flighty scatterbrained simpleton. <i>She s a total <b>airhead</b>.</i>
<b>arrogance</b>	The quality of being arrogant. <i>The <b>arrogance</b> of this man is astounding.</i>
<b>benighted</b>	Lacking enlightenment or knowledge or culture. <i><b>Benighted</b> or <b>nighted</b> travelers hurrying toward home.</i>
<b>dullard</b>	A person who evokes boredom. <i>He was caricatured as a dupe and a <b>dullard</b>.</i>
<b>dumb</b>	Make dumb or unheard silence. <i>Struck <b>dumb</b>.</i>
<b>fatuity</b>	A ludicrous folly.
<b>fatuous</b>	Silly and pointless. <i>A <b>fatuous</b> comment.</i>

<b>folly</b>	A costly ornamental building with no practical purpose, especially a tower or mock-Gothic ruin built in a large garden or park. <i>An act of sheer <b>folly</b>.</i>
<b>fool</b>	Make a fool or dupe of. <i>That damn <b>fool</b> waiter.</i>
<b>foolery</b>	Silly or foolish behaviour. <i>We endured his <b>foolery</b> all afternoon.</i>
<b>greed</b>	Excessive desire to acquire or possess more (especially more material wealth) than one needs or deserves. <i>The colonists <b>greed</b> for African land.</i>
<b>haughtiness</b>	Overbearing pride evidenced by a superior manner toward inferiors. <i>Her air of <b>haughtiness</b>.</i>
<b>hubris</b>	(in Greek tragedy) excessive pride towards or defiance of the gods, leading to nemesis. <i>The self assured <b>hubris</b> among economists was shaken in the late 1980s.</i>
<b>idiot</b>	A person of low intelligence.
<b>idiotic</b>	Having a mental age of three to seven years. <i>An <b>idiotic</b> idea.</i>
<b>ignorance</b>	Lack of knowledge or information. <i>He acted in <b>ignorance</b> of basic procedures.</i>
<b>imbecile</b>	Having a mental age of three to seven years. <i>Try not to make <b>imbecile</b> remarks.</i>
<b>imbecility</b>	A stupid mistake.
<b>inability</b>	Lack of ability (especially mental ability) to do something. <i>His <b>inability</b> to accept new ideas.</i>
<b>insanity</b>	Extreme foolishness or irrationality. <i>It might be pure <b>insanity</b> to take this loan.</i>
<b>lunacy</b>	Foolish or senseless behavior. <i>It has been suggested that originality demands a degree of <b>lunacy</b>.</i>
<b>patsy</b>	A person who is gullible and easy to take advantage of. <i>There is a mischievous sparkle in his eyes that suggests he is no <b>patsy</b>.</i>
<b>powerlessness</b>	Lack of ability, influence, or power. <i>The feeling of <b>powerlessness</b> due to poverty.</i>
<b>silly</b>	Ludicrous, foolish. <i>Knocked <b>silly</b> by the impact.</i>
<b>sucker</b>	Of a plant produce suckers. <i>If <b>suckers</b> will actually pay to do the work more fool them.</i>

Aggravation by deriding or mocking or criticizing.

Total lack of meaning or ideas.

**vacuity**

*He denounced what he considered the frivolity or **vacuity** of much contemporary painting.*

**vanity**

Low table with mirror or mirrors where one sits while dressing or applying makeup.

*The **vanity** of human wishes.*
