athletic	Relating to athletes or athletics. <i>Athletic events.</i>
brawny	Possessing physical strength and weight; rugged and powerful. <i>Gordon had brawny tattooed arms.</i>
burly	(of a person) large and strong; heavily built. <i>Had a tall burly frame.</i>
determined	Determined or decided upon as by an authority. <i>Helen was a determined little girl.</i>
firm	Marked by firm determination or resolution not shakable. <i>A firm grasp.</i>

hardy	Able to survive under unfavorable weather conditions. <i>A hardy breed of cattle.</i>
hefty	(of a person) possessing physical strength and weight; rugged and powerful. <i>A hefty young chap.</i>

mighty	Having or showing great strength or force or intensity- Bulwer-Lytton. <i>A mighty blow.</i>
muscular	Having a robust muscular body build characterized by predominance of structures bone and muscle and connective tissue developed from the embryonic mesodermal layer. <i>His legs were strong and muscular.</i>
powerful	Of a person possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. <i>The world s most powerful nation.</i>
powerfully built	Possessing physical strength and weight; rugged and powerful.
resolute	Firm in purpose or belief; characterized by firmness and determination. <i>Stood resolute against the enemy.</i>
robust	Uncompromising and forceful. <i>A robust perennial.</i>
rugged	Topographically very uneven. <i>A week of rugged demanding adventure at an outdoor training centre.</i>
serviceable	Ready for service or able to give long service. <i>Only twelve aircraft were fully serviceable this morning.</i>
solid	Of good quality and condition solidly built. <i>A solid foundation.</i>
sound	In excellent physical condition. <i>A sound argument.</i>
stable	(of a patient or their medical condition) not deteriorating in health after an injury or operation. <i>A stable ladder.</i>
stalwart	Dependable. <i>The stalwart citizens at Lexington.</i>

<u>staunch</u>	Firm and dependable especially in loyalty. <i>A staunch Catholic.</i>
steadfast	Resolutely or dutifully firm and unwavering. <i>A steadfast ally.</i>
stocky	Having a short and solid form or stature. <i>Stocky legs.</i>
<u>stout</u>	Euphemisms for `fat. <i>He put up a stout defence in court.</i>
strapping	(especially of a young person) big and strong. <i>They had three strapping sons.</i>
strong	Strong and sure. <i>Strong medicine.</i>
<u>substantial</u>	Of or relating to the real nature or essential elements of something. <i>Spirits are shadowy human beings substantial.</i>
tenacious	Sticking together. <i>A tenacious local legend.</i>
thickset	Having a short and solid form or stature. <i>A thickset boy with dark greasy hair.</i>
<u>tough</u>	Feeling physical discomfort or pain tough is occasionally used colloquially for bad. <i>A tough character.</i>
<u>uncompromising</u>	Harsh or relentless. <i>Took an uncompromising stance in the peace talks.</i>
<u>unwavering</u>	Not showing abrupt variations. <i>She fixed him with an unwavering stare.</i>
unyielding	Stubbornly unyielding T S Eliot. <i>An unyielding head support.</i>
<u>vigorous</u>	Characterized by forceful and energetic action or activity. <i>Gave her skirt a vigorous shake.</i>
well built	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.
well made	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.

<u>intrepid</u>	Fearless; adventurous (often used for rhetorical or humorous effect). <i>Intrepid pioneers.</i>
manliness	The fact of being typically male; masculinity. <i>The author s alleged lack of manliness.</i>
<u>masculine</u>	A masculine word or form. <i>A masculine cadence.</i>
medicinal	A medicinal substance. <i>Clary was once thought to have great medicinal value.</i>
<u>muscular</u>	Having a robust muscular body build characterized by predominance of structures bone and muscle and connective tissue developed from the embryonic mesodermal layer. <i>The muscular and passionate Fifth Symphony.</i>
organic	A food produced by organic farming. <i>Organic growth.</i>
recuperative	Having the effect of restoring health or strength. <i>Strongly recuperative remedies.</i>
<u>restorative</u>	A thing that restores health, strength, or well-being, especially a medicine or drink. <i>The restorative power of long walks.</i>
robust	(of a system, organization, etc.) able to withstand or overcome adverse conditions. <i>The country s political system has continued to be robust in spite of its economic problems.</i>
salubrious	(of a place) pleasant; not run-down. <i>The salubrious mountain air and water.</i>
salutary	Health-giving. <i>The salutary Atlantic air.</i>
<u>stalwart</u>	Dependable. <i>A stalwart supporter of the UN.</i>

- stout** Having or showing courage and determination.
*There is a tradition in England of drinking **stout** while eating oysters.*
- tough** Physically toughened.
*Some plastics are as **tough** as metal.*
- unflinching** Not shrinking from danger.
*He has shown **unflinching** determination throughout the campaign.*
- vigorous** Strong, healthy, and full of energy.
*A **vigorous** old man who spent half of his day on horseback.*
- virile** Having strength, energy, and a strong sex drive (typically used of a man).
*A new and **virile** leadership.*
- wholesome** Conducive to or characterized by moral well-being.
