
## Stylish as an Adjective

- Fashionably elegant and sophisticated.








## Synonyms of "Stylish" as an adjective (8 Words)

<u>modern</u>	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. <i>Modern furniture</i> .
modish	In the current fashion or style. It seems sad that such a scholar should feel compelled to use this <b>modish</b> jargon.
trendsetting	Initiating or popularizing a trend.
up to date	Open.
up to the minute	Out of bed.
voguish	In accord with the latest fad. A suit of <b>voguish</b> cut.








#### Usage Examples of "Stylish" as an adjective

# Associations of "Stylish" (30 Words)

abreast	Side by side and facing the same way. It makes sense to stay <b>abreast</b> of changes in the advertising business.
<u>alongside</u>	Side by side.
canard	A small winglike projection attached to an aircraft forward of the main wing to provide extra stability or control, sometimes replacing the tail. <i>The old canard that LA is a cultural wasteland</i> .
<u>chic</u>	Elegant and stylish. <i>Chic elegance.</i>
craze	Cause to go crazy; cause to lose one's mind. Internal stresses often caused the glue to <b>craze</b> .
current	Dominant course (suggestive of running water) of successive events or ideas. <i>Current psychoanalytic theories.</i>
<u>dapper</u>	Neat and trim in dress and appearance (typically used of a man. A <b>dapper</b> young man.
fad	An interest followed with exaggerated zeal. His <b>fad</b> s about the type of coffee he must have.
faddish	Intensely fashionable or popular for a short period of time. Superficial <b>faddish</b> approaches to spirituality.
fashion	A popular or the latest style of clothing, hair, decoration, or behaviour. <i>The skins were</i> <b>fashion</b> ed into boots and shoes.
<u>fashionable</u>	Popular and considered appealing or fashionable at the time. They risked being scoffed at by their more <b>fashionable</b> friends.
flamboyant	Showy tropical tree or shrub native to Madagascar; widely planted in tropical regions for its immense racemes of scarlet and orange flowers; sometimes placed in genus Poinciana. <i>Flamboyant</i> handwriting.
jaunty	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. A <b>jaunty</b> optimist.
lately	In the recent past. <i>Lately</i> the rules have been enforced.
<u>latest</u>	Of most recent date. The <b>latest</b> news.
maverick	An unbranded calf or yearling. <i>Maverick</i> politicians.

In the current fashion or style. It seems sad that such a scholar should feel compelled to use this <b>modish</b> jargon.
Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. A palmtop computer with many <b>natty</b> features.

(of music or art) new and of general appeal (especially among young people. <i>The <b>popular</b> vote.</i>
Unconventional and slightly disreputable, especially in an attractive way. A cocktail party given by some <b>raffish</b> bachelors.
Marked by a carefree unconventionality or disreputableness. <i>He had a <b>rakish</b> debonair look.</i>
The property of having happened or appeared not long ago.
Light soft moderately strong wood of spruce trees used especially for timbers and millwork. <i>He</i> <b>spruce</b> <i>d up for the party.</i>
Not conforming to accepted rules or standards. <i>His <b>unconventional</b> approach to life.</i>
Independent in behavior or thought. An <b>unorthodox</b> lifestyle.
Provide with a dateline; mark with a date.
Polished courtesy; elegance of manner. A picture of banal <b>urbanity</b> .
The popular taste at a given time. <i>Leather is the latest <b>vogue</b></i> .
