## Associations of "Stylish" (30 Words)

<b>abreast</b>	Side by side and facing the same way. <i>It makes sense to stay <b>abreast</b> of changes in the advertising business.</i>
<b>alongside</b>	Side by side. A small winglike projection attached to an aircraft forward of the main wing to provide extra stability or control, sometimes replacing the tail. <i>The old <b>canard</b> that LA is a cultural wasteland.</i>
<b>canard</b>	Elegant and stylish. <i><b>Chic</b> elegance.</i>
<b>chic</b>	Cause to go crazy; cause to lose one's mind. <i>Internal stresses often caused the glue to <b>craze</b>.</i>
<b>craze</b>	Dominant course (suggestive of running water) of successive events or ideas. <i><b>Current</b> psychoanalytic theories.</i>
<b>current</b>	Neat and trim in dress and appearance (typically used of a man). <i>A <b>dapper</b> young man.</i>
<b>dapper</b>	An interest followed with exaggerated zeal. <i>His <b>fads</b> about the type of coffee he must have.</i>
<b>fad</b>	Intensely fashionable or popular for a short period of time. <i>Superficial <b>faddish</b> approaches to spirituality.</i>
<b>faddish</b>	A popular or the latest style of clothing, hair, decoration, or behaviour. <i>The skins were <b>fashioned</b> into boots and shoes.</i>
<b>fashion</b>	Popular and considered appealing or fashionable at the time. <i>They risked being scoffed at by their more <b>fashionable</b> friends.</i>
<b>fashionable</b>	Showy tropical tree or shrub native to Madagascar; widely planted in tropical regions for its immense racemes of scarlet and orange flowers; sometimes placed in genus Poinciana. <i><b>Flamboyant</b> handwriting.</i>
<b>flamboyant</b>	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>A <b>jaunty</b> optimist.</i>
<b>jaunty</b>	In the recent past. <i><b>Lately</b> the rules have been enforced.</i>
<b>lately</b>	Of most recent date. <i>The <b>latest</b> news.</i>
<b>latest</b>	An unbranded calf or yearling. <i><b>Maverick</b> politicians.</i>
<b>maverick</b>	

<b>modern</b>	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. <i>Tables in <b>modernistic</b> designs.</i>
<b>modish</b>	In the current fashion or style. <i>It seems sad that such a scholar should feel compelled to use this <b>modish</b> jargon.</i>
<b>natty</b>	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>A palmtop computer with many <b>natty</b> features.</i>
<b>offbeat</b>	(informal) strikingly unconventional. <i>The answer sums up his <b>offbeat</b> skewed vision of the world.</i>
<b>popular</b>	(of music or art) new and of general appeal (especially among young people). <i>The <b>popular</b> vote.</i>
<b>raffish</b>	Unconventional and slightly disreputable, especially in an attractive way. <i>A cocktail party given by some <b>raffish</b> bachelors.</i>
<b>rakish</b>	Marked by a carefree unconventionality or disreputableness. <i>He had a <b>rakish</b> debonair look.</i>
<b>recency</b>	The property of having happened or appeared not long ago.
<b>spruce</b>	Light soft moderately strong wood of spruce trees used especially for timbers and millwork. <i>He <b>spruced</b> up for the party.</i>
<b>unconventional</b>	Not conforming to accepted rules or standards. <i>His <b>unconventional</b> approach to life.</i>
<b>unorthodox</b>	Independent in behavior or thought. <i>An <b>unorthodox</b> lifestyle.</i>
<b>up-to-date</b>	Provide with a dateline; mark with a date.
<b>urbanity</b>	Polished courtesy; elegance of manner. <i>A picture of banal <b>urbanity</b>.</i>
<b>vogue</b>	The popular taste at a given time. <i>Leather is the latest <b>vogue</b>.</i>
