- *Having a sophisticated charm.*

- bland** Lacking strong features or characteristics and therefore uninteresting.
*A **bland** diet.*
- charming** (of a person or their manner) very polite, friendly, and likeable.
***Charming** incantations.*
- civilized** At an advanced stage of social and cultural development.
*A **civilized** society.*
- debonair** Having a cheerful, lively, and self-confident air- Frances G. Patton-
H.M.Reynolds.
*Life that is gay brisk and **debonair**.*
- debonaire** Having a cheerful, lively, and self-confident air.
- debonnaire** Having a sophisticated charm.
- dignified** Having or showing self-esteem.
*She maintained a **dignified** silence.*

<u>gallant</u>	Having or displaying great dignity or nobility. <i>A gallant warrior.</i>
gentlemanly	Befitting a gentleman. <i>A gentlemanly profession.</i>
<u>poised</u>	Having a graceful and elegant bearing. <i>She had learnt from the girls at the salon how to appear perfectly poised.</i>
<u>polished</u>	(of grains especially rice) having the husk or outer layers removed. <i>His polished performance in the film.</i>
politic	Smoothly agreeable and courteous with a degree of sophistication. <i>I did not think it politic to express my reservations.</i>
<u>refined</u>	Showing a high degree of refinement and the assurance that comes from wide social experience. <i>Refined sugar.</i>
self-possessed	In full control of your faculties.
<u>smooth</u>	Smoothly agreeable and courteous with a degree of sophistication. <i>Graphics are excellent with fast smooth scrolling.</i>
<u>sophisticated</u>	Appealing to or frequented by people who are sophisticated. <i>A chic sophisticated woman.</i>
urbane	Showing a high degree of refinement and the assurance that comes from wide social experience. <i>Urbane wit was the mark of taste and cultivation.</i>
<u>worldly</u>	Characteristic of or devoted to the temporal world as opposed to the spiritual world. <i>His ambitions for worldly success.</i>
worldly-wise	Experienced in and wise to the ways of the world.



Usage Examples of "Suave" as an adjective

- *All the waiters were suave and deferential.*

beauty	A combination of qualities that pleases the intellect. <i>She was considered a great beauty in her youth.</i>
belle	A young woman who is the most charming and beautiful of several rivals. <i>She was the belle of the ball.</i>
<u>charm</u>	Protect through supernatural powers or charms. <i>His charm has captivated the media.</i>

comeliness	The quality of being good looking and attractive.
cultivated	No longer in the natural state; developed by human care and for human use. <i>Cultivated roses.</i>
cultured	Characterized by refined taste and manners and good education. <i>A cultured and intelligent man.</i>
debonair	Having a cheerful, lively, and self-confident air. <i>Life that is gay brisk and debonair.</i>
decency	The quality of conforming to standards of propriety and morality. <i>She had the decency to come and confess.</i>
elegance	The quality of being pleasingly ingenious and simple; neatness. <i>A slender woman with grace and elegance.</i>
enchantingly	In a bewitching manner.
foppish	Affecting extreme elegance in dress and manner. <i>He is foppish and vain.</i>
gentility	Social superiority as demonstrated by polite and respectable manners, behaviour, or appearances. <i>Her grandmother's pretensions to gentility.</i>
gentleman	A manservant who acts as a personal attendant to his employer. <i>He behaved throughout like a perfect gentleman.</i>

gracefully	In a gracious or graceful manner. <i>He has aged gracefully.</i>
gracefulness	Beautiful carriage.
gracious	(in Christian belief) showing divine grace. <i>Gracious even to unexpected visitors.</i>
graciously	In a courteous, kind, and pleasant manner. <i>He smiled graciously.</i>
jaunty	Having a cheerful, lively, and self-confident air- Frances G. Patton- H.M.Reynolds. <i>Walked with a jaunty step.</i>
mincing	Affectedly dainty or refined. <i>I don t have to go through the rest of my life with that mincing voice of yours.</i>
nobleman	A titled peer of the realm.
poise	Great coolness and composure under strain. <i>Poise and good deportment can be cultivated.</i>
politic	Engage in political activity. <i>He was too politic to quarrel with so important a personage.</i>
refined	Showing a high degree of refinement and the assurance that comes from wide social experience. <i>Refined people with refined taste.</i>
sophisticated	Appealing to or frequented by people who are sophisticated. <i>Discussion and reflection are necessary for a sophisticated response to a text.</i>
sophistication	The quality of being sophisticated. <i>Her air of sophistication and confidence.</i>
svelte	Showing a high degree of refinement and the assurance that comes from wide social experience. <i>She was svelte and sophisticated.</i>
tasteful	Free from what is tawdry or unbecoming. <i>A tasteful lounge bar.</i>
urbane	Showing a high degree of refinement and the assurance that comes from wide social experience. <i>The supposedly urbane restrained English gentleman.</i>
