answerable (of a question) able to be answered.

**corporeal**Affecting or characteristic of the body as opposed to the mind or spirit.

That which is created is of necessity **corporeal** and visible and tangible.

debatable Open to doubt or debate.

It is **debatable** whether the country is coming out of recession.

**discussion** A detailed treatment of a topic in speech or writing.

enigma A difficult problem.

Madeleine was still an **enigma** to him.

**forum** A court or tribunal.

**heading** A division of a subject; a class or category.

The **heading** seemed to have little to do with the text.

**inquire** Inquire about.

How well do you know Berlin he **inquire**d of Hencke.

inquiry A search for knowledge.

He was one of the State's star witnesses in the murder **inquiry**.

Transmit (a signal) for setting off an appropriate response, as in

<u>interrogate</u> telecommunication.

An interactive system enables users to **interrogate** the database.

An instance of questioning.

*interrogation* Would he keep his mouth shut under *interrogation*.

**interrogative** Some linguists consider interrogative sentences to constitute a mood.

An **interrogative** adverb.

Relating to the use of or having the nature of an interrogation.

She abandoned her **interrogatory** monologue.

Go for an interview in the hope of being hired.

She was **interview**ed by a reporter from the Daily News.

Make out and issue.

The canyon had only one **issue**.

Offensively curious or inquisitive.

thematic Having or relating to subjects or a particular subject.

The book is organized into nine **thematic** chapters.

theme Provide with a particular theme or motive.

His letters were always on the **theme** of love.

topic A matter dealt with in a text, discourse, or conversation; a subject.

It was a very sensitive **topic**.
