### Synonyms of "Subsection" as a noun (24 Words)

<a href="#">arm</a>	Any projection that is thought to resemble a human arm. <i>A large walnut desk chair with padded <b>arms</b>.</i>
<b>bit</b>	The cutting part of a drill usually pointed and threaded and is replaceable in a brace or bitstock or drill press. <i>Working in a foreign country took quite a <b>bit</b> of getting used to.</i>
<a href="#">branch</a>	A part of a forked or branching shape. <i>A <b>branch</b> of the Clinton River.</i>
<b>bureau</b>	A government department. <i>The London <b>bureau</b> of the Washington Post.</i>
<a href="#">chunk</a>	A compact mass. <i>Huge <b>chunks</b> of masonry littered the street.</i>

<b>component</b>	Each of two or more forces, velocities, or other vectors acting in different directions which are together equivalent to a given vector. <i>Spare <b>components</b> for cars.</i>
<b>department</b>	A specialized division of a large organization. <i>The turnout was particularly low in rural <b>departments</b>.</i>
<b>detachment</b>	Coming apart. <i>A truck containing a <b>detachment</b> of villagers.</i>
<u><b>extension</b></u>	The most direct or specific meaning of a word or expression; the class of objects that an expression refers to. <i>Good <b>extension</b> comes from a combination of training and native ability.</i>
<b>fragment</b>	A piece broken off or cut off of something else. <i>Small <b>fragments</b> of pottery.</i>
<b>office</b>	A service conducted daily as part of the office. <i>Being in <b>office</b> already gives a candidate a great advantage.</i>
<b>offshoot</b>	A natural consequence of development. <i>Commercial <b>offshoots</b> of universities.</i>
<b>part</b>	A melody or other constituent of harmony assigned to a particular voice or instrument in a musical work. <i>He wanted to feel a <b>part</b> of something bigger than himself.</i>
<b>piece</b>	A coin of specified value. <i>He sacrificed a <b>piece</b> to get a strategic advantage.</i>
<u><b>portion</b></u>	Something less than the whole of a human artifact. <i>His <b>portion</b> was larger than hers.</i>
<b>satellite</b>	Transmitted by satellite using or relating to satellite technology. <i>The report was sent via <b>satellite</b>.</i>
<u><b>section</b></u>	A land unit equal to 1 square mile. <i>A <b>section</b> of a fishing rod.</i>
<u><b>sector</b></u>	The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>The government aimed to reassure the industrial and commercial <b>sector</b>.</i>
<b>segment</b>	One of the parts into which something naturally divides. <i>Orange <b>segments</b>.</i>
<b>share</b>	Assets belonging to or due to or contributed by an individual person or group. <i>There have been 25 000 <b>shares</b> on Twitter and 117 likes on Facebook as of 7 30 p m.</i>
<u><b>slice</b></u>	A thin, broad piece of food, such as bread, meat, or cake, cut from a larger portion. <i>Potato <b>slices</b>.</i>

- subdivision** A self-contained part of a larger composition (written or musical).  
*Such an arrangement offers the possibility of **subdivision** into a series of identical spaces.*
- subsidiary** A thing that is of lesser importance than but related to something else.  
*The firm's Spanish **subsidiary**.*
- wing** The wing of a bird as food.  
*Michael earned his **wings** as a commercial pilot.*
