- Denoting or relating to production at a level sufficient only for one's own use or consumption, without any surplus for trade.
- The state of existing in reality; having substance.
- The action or fact of maintaining or supporting oneself, especially at a minimal level.
- A means of surviving.
- Minimal (or marginal) resources for subsisting.
